Whenever you see the “Export Citations” button on Cambridge Core, you can export a citation for the content listed.

Export Citation(s) from Search Page

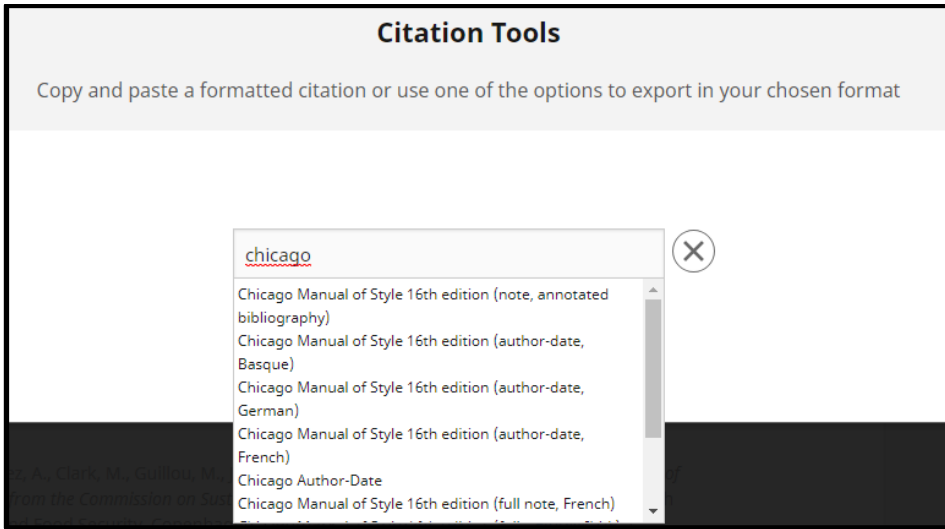
1. Select one or more search results via the checkboxes to the left
