2. Executive summary

As planned in the initial submission document, the project lead by MNHN is divided into three phases. The first step has been completed. The second phase is ongoing. Thus, the calendar of the project implementation is fully respected.

During the first phase of the project, which took place between July and October 2019, we endeavoured to give every partner involved in it an access and a full proficiency of the Bioland tool, together with the understanding of the GBIF process and methods. A five days' workshop tailored to the CHM managers of the stakeholder countries was organized in Brussels, from September 30th, to October 4th. Two days devoted to the Bioland training and two days dedicated to the GBIF data acquisition were on the program of this workshop. Thus, the partners were enabled to start the implementation of the Bioland tool in their national CHM.

Phase two began in October with the development of the GBIF module, in compliance with technical specifications set by the partners and with the support of Alexandre Rafalovitch, in charge of the development of the Bioland tool in the CBD Secretariat. We also started to pen the specification use manual (booklet) which will provide guidance to any country or organization interested in adopting the Bioland tool and having access to GBIF datas via it.



In addition, a helpdesk has been provided by the coordinator of the project to help countries migrate to the Bioland tool at every step of this migration. Phase two is to end in February 2020, i.e. just before the second workshop. This second workshop will encompass presentations of the Bioland tool, the GBIF module and the booklet to all the GBIF nodal points of the involved countries.

The outcomes of this second workshop will enable us to implement the final phase of the project. We will finalize the implementation of Bioland by integrating the GBIF module in it. Besides, we will disseminate the booklet. By doing so, we should have created an ecosystem whose aim is to make the users from the CHM and GBIF communities beware of their synergies and eager to more often collaborate in the future.

Based upon "good practice's sharing", the project has sparked pretty good outcomes so far. For instance, some tricky and harmful issues at institutional (e.g. antagonisms between some GBIF and CHM national focal points) or technical levels were rapidly identified and were successfully solved thanks to the sharing of a partner's specific knowledge or relevant experience. These different levels of knowledge and experiences are what we are planning to highlight in the final booklet.

In order to make sure that each partner has the same level of capacity and ability at every step of the project implementation, each phase is completely based on the needs of the partners. In addition to a permanent helpdesk led by the coordinator, a whatsapps permanent group and a google drive dedicated to documents' exchange, we decided to organize the two workshops at the end of each phase so that partners could exchange their views upon what had been implemented. It is also a means of getting the insurance that the final deliverables will take their needs into account.

We are also paying close attention to the quality of the links between partners as it is an important condition for the sustainability of the project. The project has already been a long way to building up a strong network of partners, both at international and regional levels. We still continue to develop it in line with different communication events, especially during the latest SBSTTA, last November.
