### **Final Narrative Report**

### **Executive Summary**

SPREP recruited an experienced and high quality project management team to deliver the project. These appointments capitalized on existing structures and personnel. It included key players from the previous BID funded project. They brought experience, confidence and lessons learned along with a clear understanding of where the opportunities were, to add value to aligned initiatives.

The activities as per the Operational Schedule are complete.

Compared with the 2 other BID funded projects that are being delivered concurrently, the "Institutional" project is less subject to delays as a result of the pandemic.

The SPREP Invasives Team has led engagement with GBIF since the start of this project. Delivery of the project activities has led to more integration of data sharing into SPREP policy and process. Gaining the attention of SPREP Staff is always a challenge - Staff are under constant and unrelenting pressure. It is impossible to expect that they can attend a week long Regional Data Mobilization Workshop. This was demonstrated in Phase 1.

Although only a modest list of data for mobilization are presented here, there is massive opportunity for data mobilization to be institutionalized with the effect of all biodiversity survey work procured by SPREP in the future to be published to GBIF. It is hoped that the datasets identified in the project proposal will be published in the future.

We did get 52 datasets, however it was across the 3 BID projects. Some of the datasets were different to those identified in the Project Proposal, due to the wants, needs and preferences of the project participants.

### Communications and visibility

The project webpage provides another opportunity for project visibility. We have reviewed the page and have nothing further to add at this stage.

The primary focus of the planned communication actions was the Initial Engagement Event for SPREP Staff and subsequent follow up meetings. This is effectively a public declaration of SPREPs support for GBIF and engagement with data sharing and data use for decision making. The idea is that this will lead to increased interest from the SPREP member countries and territories, further promotion of the PBIF and the increased institutionalization of data mobilization and use processes.

### Sustainability

### Sustainability Plans

The sustainability plan from the project proposal was accurate. The benefits of these amendments to process will be sustained.

"Share Pacific Invasive Species data using GBIF" was reviewed and updated to include information about the Pacific Biodiversity Information Facility. This includes a significant section on how to access data to support more informed decision making added to the set of existing Battler Series publications. These aim to take technical and scientific information and present these in a way that is accessible, engaging and educational for Pacific people. The guide is available in French also.

### Impact of COVID-19 pandemic on project implementation

Despite the challenges and uncertainty, we managed to get the project activities completed. However, as previously described, the levels of engagement were not what we had anticipated or hoped for. For many Pacific Island communities, the pandemic presented existential challenges with severe economic impacts due to the loss of tourism, travel and commercial activity generally. When the borders finally opened, many of our partner agencies were forced to prioritise engagement and activities in extreme ways. This affected SPREP staff also.

During the project implementation period, our partner countries faced cyclones, volcanic eruptions, civil unrest, earthquakes, tsunamis, infrastructure failure and a global pandemic.

Due to the travel restrictions, the window for many of the project activities was very limited and the road to recovery for many of the Pacific Islands will be very long.

GBIF leads the Biodiversity Information for Development (BID), a programme funded by the European Union. The programme provides supplementary support for activities addressing the needs of regional researchers and policymakers through mobilization and use of biodiversity data.
