3. Overview of results

3.1. Executive summary

The main activities during the reporting period were registration, initiation workshop and data collection. An initiation workshop was held from 01 to 02 March 2018 in Bindura. Workshop participants included representatives from the five communities, government and non-governmental organisations. A total of 42 participants attended the workshop. The workshop started with some opening remarks from the Dean of the faculty of Agriculture and Environmental Science and was officially opened by a representative from the office of the Resident Minister for Mashonaland Central Province. The workshop activities included outline of project and workshop objectives. Presentations were given by the project coordinator, team members and guests from Natural History Museums and Monuments of Zimbabwe. An overview of NTFP species in Zimbabwe was given by a representative from National Herbarium and Botanic Gardens. Group discussions on food and medicinal plants in each biodiversity hotspot area were led by community representatives. The initial discussions were on prioritisation of food plants followed by medicinal plants. Each group prioritised and ranked the species in each area with a final presentation in the plenary session. Participants were however, sceptical on the publicity of information on medicinal plants. Prioritised species were discussed in vernacular and these were later converted to scientific names, by taxonomists and botanists from Bindura University and National Herbarium.

5.1. Relationship with project partners

Bindura University continues to work with the National Herbarium and Botanic Gardens (NHBC) to update and digitize the lists of food and medicinal plants in the biodiversity hotspots using archives of biodiversity information, kept mainly in the form of un-digitized herbarium specimens. We will make the data easily accessible for key decision making and research. The Forestry Commission will help in mobilizing communities for the meetings and other conservation strategies that may be needed. Furthermore, we continue to work with the Ministry of Environment, Water and Climate, mainly the Biodiversity office. The existence of the GBIF platform will be shared with other Universities, researchers, policy makers and forest users.

5.2. Links to other projects and actions

This is our first project. The project team is working closely with the Mentor whose organization is also having several BID funded projects. At the initiation workshop, we discussed with stakeholders on the issue of becoming a node. Only two organisations in the country (Bindura University and the National History Museum and Monuments) are familiar with BID issues. The Ministry of Environment, Water and Climate appointed Bindura University to work as the node for Zimbabwe.

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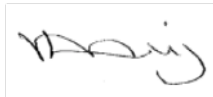
