3. Overview of results

3.1. Executive summary

Give a short summary of the activities implemented and the outcomes of the project for the reporting period (500 words maximum)

First BID Partners' meeting held at Forestry Research Institute of Nigeria (FRIN), 11th October, 2017 with 10 participants. Completed capacity self-assessment questionnaire for national biodiversity information facilities was done and at first instance, we scored 28/120, while we improved on the second self-assessment, scoring 47/120. **Dr. Oluwaseun A. Osiyemi** from the project team has completed the certification process following the BID Capacity Enhancement workshop on Data Mobilization organized as a part of the BID programme Africa 2017, held in South Africa. He was the major facilitator on knowledge dissemination activities at the first BID Capacity Enhancement workshop held on 23-24 January, 2018, at Forestry Research Institute of Nigeria, Ibadan, Oyo State, Nigeria. About 40 people attended the program. All the partner project partners with their sub-teams attended the training; two of the project partners personally attended (Prof. P.C. Nnabude of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka; and Dr. O.A Okeyoyin of National Park Service, Abuja together with their sub-teams while Dr. Egbewole Z. T of Nasarawa State University Keffi was represented by Odunayo Rotowa and Dr Onoja Joseph Daniel of Nigeria Conservation Foundation was represented by Joshua Dazi and Lawal Ibukun Aiyengbe. The Insect Team from FRIN, Dr. O.T. Alamu, Mrs. O.T Fatunmibi and Ayandokun Ayangbade were also in attendance.

On the second day, mid-way into the training session, there was a discussion on **the way forward for NgBIF**. It was agreed that an Association of Nigeria Biodiversity Information Facility be formed and the subsequent development of a website (<http://www.ngbif.org.ng>) for it. We charged ourselves to be GBIF ambassadors in our respective Institution. The Executive Director of Forestry Research Institute of Nigeria (EDFRIN) and Head of Delegation for NgBIF (HDNgBIF) and the Node manager NgBIF (NMNgBIF) were encouraged to continue to see to the successful development and advancement of GBIF in Nigeria. One national data publishing institution, Forestry Research Institute of Nigeria, has been registered with GBIF.org **while** discussion is on-going with the possibility of using Data Hosting-SANBI-GBIF Node.

We have mobilized over 3,000 specimens of Poaceae, but currently undergoing corrections and imaging. The project partners have been mobilized with some equipment purchased and are working on data mobilization.
