3. Overview of results

3.1. Executive summary

Give a short summary of the activities implemented and the outcomes of the project for the reporting period (500 words maximum)

The use of herbal medicine in Ghana is widespread, but highly diverse owing to floristic and cultural diversity, such that traditional medicine has major impacts on the local economy and on biodiversity conservation. Many species of medicinal plants used in Ghana have become threatened thanks to factors such as unsustainable wild harvesting, habitat loss, changing land use and climate change. We have catalogued a checklist of threatened medicinal plants for the Ghana through a stakeholders' meeting organized at the Centre for Plant Medicine as part of this project. Digitization of data about medicinal plants has begun though on a pilot scale at partner institutions to ensure digital preservation of indigenous cultured heritage, and biodiversity conservation can be enhanced when comprehensive information about the plants is openly available. One person from the project has attended a BID capacity enhancement workshop in Cape Town, South Africa, and knowledge dissemination activities have been scheduled to take place within the first quarter of 2018. Digitization and sharing of data on medicinal plants as well as development of information products will be the major activities in the coming months.
