It will be impossible for us to make full use of the occurrence data without precise coordinate information for making biodiversity related assessment and research. Therefore, this project focuses on compiling a multi-language gazetteer of occurrence distribution in Asia from different data sources, including specimens, books, articles and notebooks. Most initiative data source is from current non-georeferenced specimen records in GBIF. It is an online system which can accept multi-language inputting and editing from professional or volunteer users all over Asia to display the historical changes of the place names associated biodiversity hotspot area. At the beginning, we mainly focus on the locality names in China, Chinese Taipei, Indonesia, Vietnam, Japan and Malaysia.
