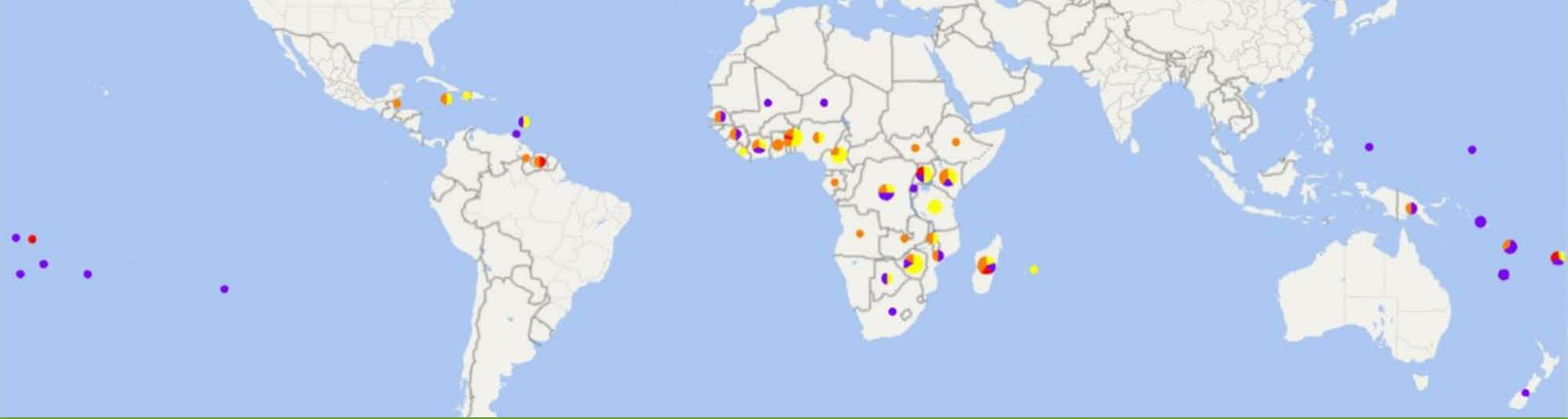

## FUNDED PROJECTS

63 funded projects in sub-Saharan Africa, Caribbean and Pacific:

- 46 in sub-Saharan Africa (2 calls for proposals)
- 8 in the Caribbean (1 call for proposals)
- 5 in the Pacific (1 call for proposals)



## DATA MOBILIZATION

559 datasets with a BID Project identifier:

- 423 occurrence datasets
- 110 checklists
- 16 sampling event datasets
- 10 metadata datasets
- Nearly 1.3 millions occurrence



## CAPACITY BUILDING

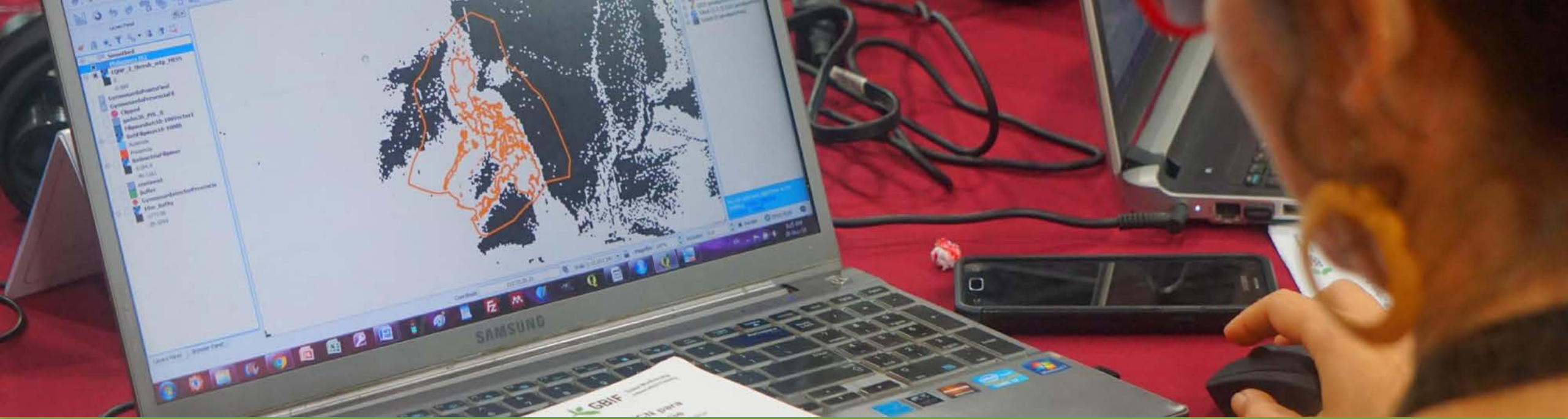
Development of 3 curricula:

- 2 Regional engagement meetings in each region
- 1 Closing event of the first phase of BID

## DATA USE

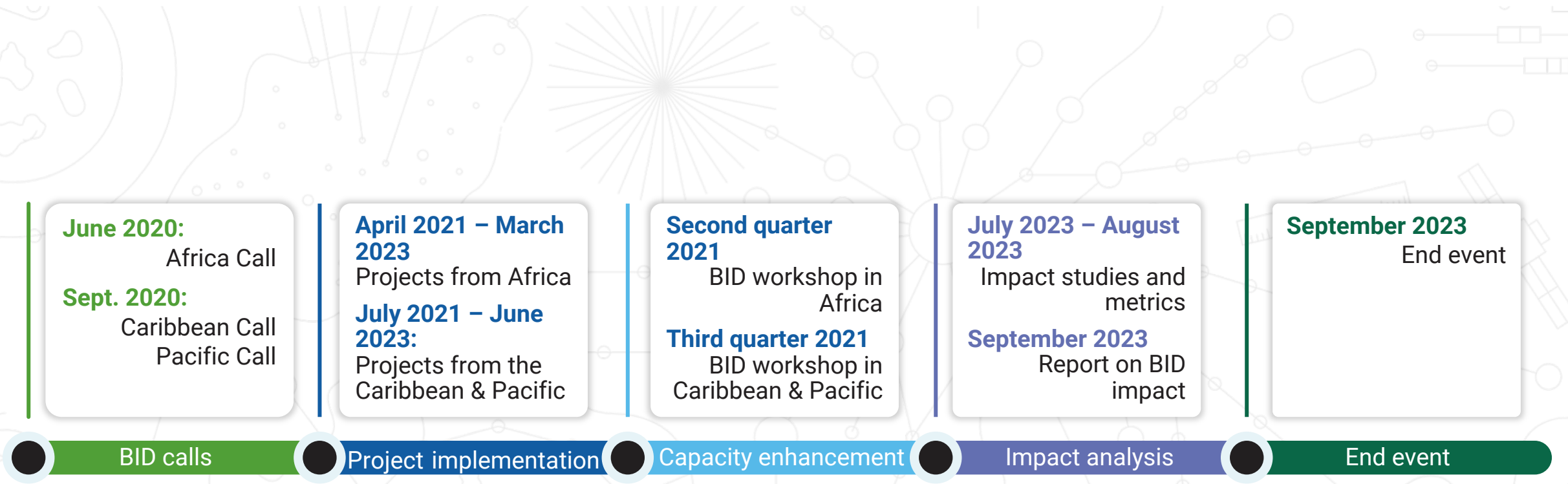
- Publication of BID Best Practices for Mobilizing Policy-Relevant Data

Note that you can not edit your profile after submission, so please ensure you enter accurate information when completing the registration form.

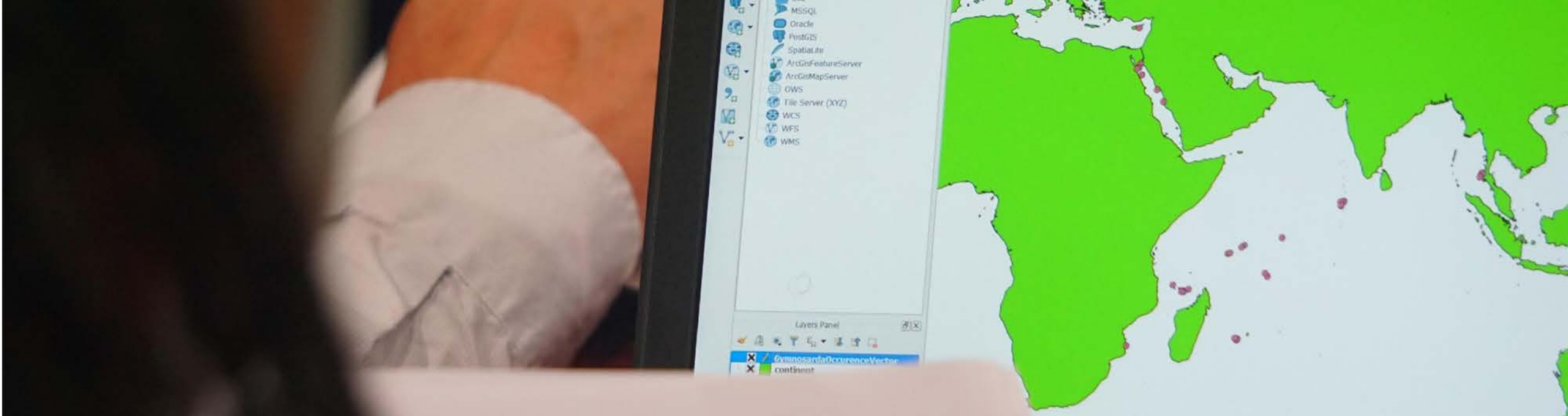
Once submitted, you will receive an email notification from GBIF within 1-2 working days with your login information. Do not forget to check your spam folder for the email.

## DATA USE GRANT

- New type of grant in which data mobilization and derived information resources respond clearly to pre-defined decision or policy needs relating to sustainable development
- Build on existing relationships between experienced biodiversity data-publishing institutions, and end-users
- Outcomes: tangible examples of data mobilization to support specific policy objectives

- By contributing to a Regional helpdesk for data mobilization

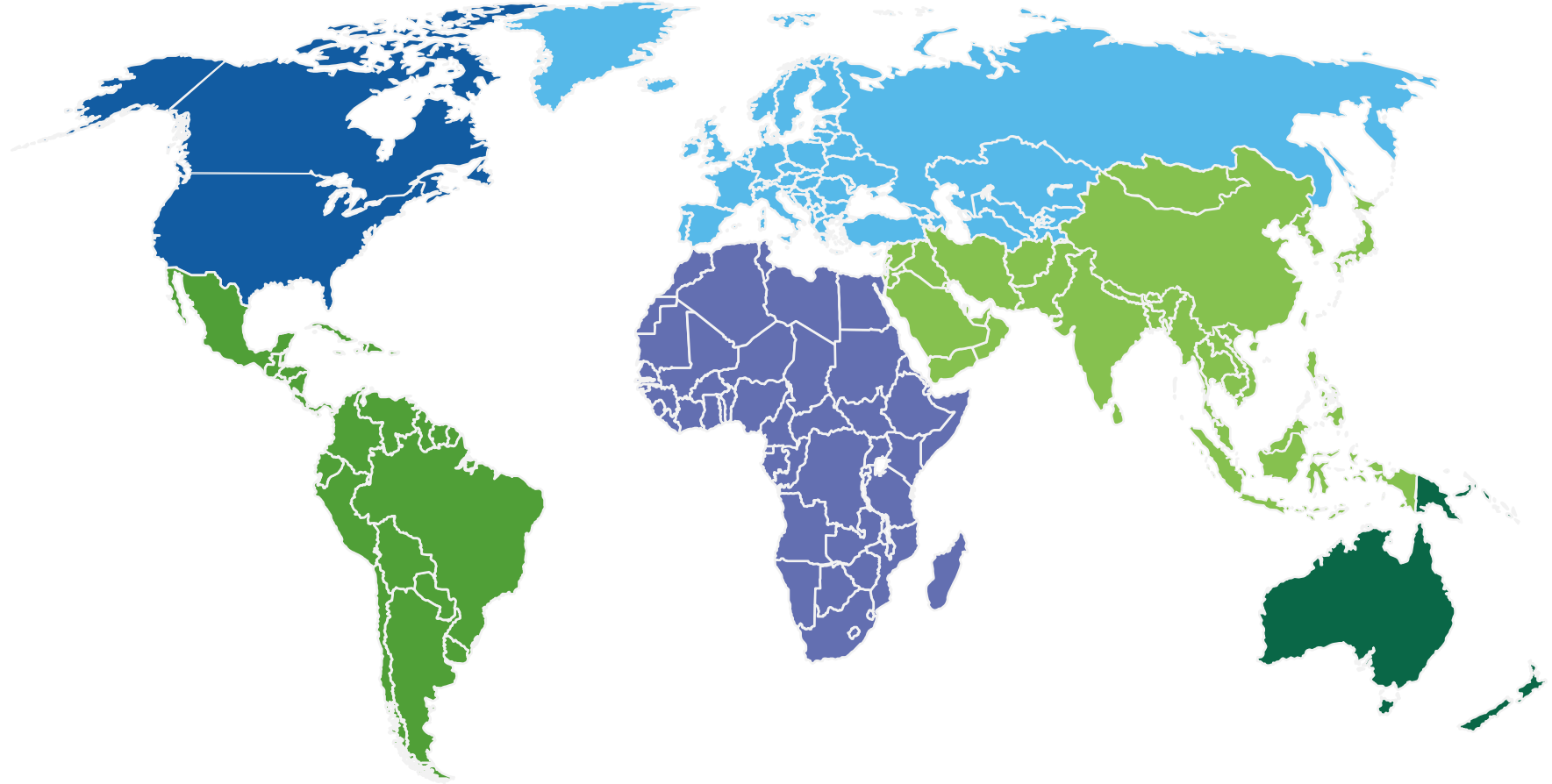
## Mentors and trainers
