3. Overview of results

3.1. Executive summary

Give a short summary of the activities implemented and the outcomes of the project for the reporting period (500 words maximum)

Most of the milestones for this reporting period were met. Knowledge dissemination activities have been scheduled and expected to be carried out in the month of February 2018. National Commision for Science and Technology registered with GBIF as a national data publishing institution, however their server is not accessible at the moment pending further work on connectivity.

Activities planned to have commenced during the reporting period included: Specimen barcode labels, Human capacity building, Website development, Targeted specimen data mobilisation, Targeted plant specimen digitizing, Targeted animal specimen digitizing and Sensitisation materials. Various institutions were visited for biodiversity data mobilization; there were varying degrees of success with respect to availability of targeted datasets. Some institutions expected to host such data simply had no records. Digitisation activities are pending knowledge dissemination activities and engagement of data entry clerks. Similarly, Human capacity building will benefit from knowledge dissemination activities; but a further training on digitization using BRAHMS was earlier conceived to benefit a wider range of partners. For example, Department of Museums and Monuments will utilize the same BRAHMS to digitize pollinator species. Procurement of service providers for website development is in very early stages. Partners agreed that flyres would be reasonably produced within the budget to target many end users. A draft flyer is available for reproduction after finalization as sensitization materials at the onset of the project.

There has been consultation with our GBIF node on project matters requiring the node's facilitation i.e. self-capacity assessment, registration of publishing institution. The BID project will be digitizing Threatened Plants using the Malawi Red Data List produced under the Southern Africa Botanical Network (SABONET) Project around early 2000s. The BID project is also building upon/complementing digitization synergies of University of Oxford who have provided equipment (camera, barcode scanner) & consumables (printed barcode labels) to MAL. Through BID funding we expect to purchase more barcode scanners and printed barcode labels. Knowledge gained through the Capacity Enhancement Workshops will benefit digitization of the whole collection. The project is also collaborating with the Africa Biodiversity Challenge project, implemented by both MoM and NHBG.
