


Avoiding Enclosed Spaces Was Never So Much Fun!

Enjoy a 33.3 km mountain drive through the magnificent scenery of Hakusan National Park to Shirakawa-go, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Observation decks along the way offer incredible views of waterfalls, pristine beech forests, and more. This 1,736 m mountain offers a panoramic view of Mt. Hakusan and the Northern Alps. The Hakusan Shirakawa-go White Road also has a parking area on this mountain, 1,445 m above sea level, where travelers can enjoy a walk along mountain ridge paths, perfect for beginners! 8

Grand Openings

Nezumitamon Gate & Bridge

Opened Jul. 18, 2020

Nezumitamon Gate and Bridge, serving as an entrance to the Kanaya Demaru citadel (now Oyama-jinja Shrine), where the feudal lord's family residence was located. After some 140 years, they have both been rebuilt! Visitors can now go directly from Kanazawa Castle Park to Oyama-jinja Shrine, passing first through Nezumitamon Gate, then crossing Nezumitamon Bridge — from there, it's not a long walk to the Nagamachi Samurai District, for a great new tour route of this beautiful castle town. Nezumitamon Gate and Bridge are also lit up on Fridays, Saturdays, and the nights before national holidays, for a lovely way to enjoy their stately, old-fashioned beauty.
