



)	Kenrokuen Kenrokumachi, Kanazawa City 076-234-3800 [Open] 7:00~18:00 (3/1~10/15) 8:00~17:00 (10/16~The end of February) [Days Closed, etc.] Open throughout the year	Kenrokuen is a typical Daimyo (feudal lord) garden established during the Edo period that passes on the characteristics of strolling-style landscape gardens incorporating ponds. Kenrokuen started out with the construction of Renchi-tei garden by the 5th lord Tsunanori Maeda, which was then developed into the current form by the 13th lord Nariyasu through the expansion of Kasumigaike pond in 1837. The name "Kenrokuen" means that the garden has six features: spaciousness, seclusion, artifice, antiquity, water-courses and panoramas. The castle was occupied by 14 generations of the Maeda family of Kaga domain until 1869; however, the castle was turned into an army position from the Meiji period until the end of the war. It was then utilized as Kanazawa University campus until 1995. The Fourth High School Memorial Museum of Cultural Exchange, Ishikawa exhibits articles that hand down the history of the Fourth High School under the old system of education. Ishikawa Modern Literature Museum exhibits documents of literary persons related to Ishikawa and conducts public readings.	Adults

From old fine art works to modern art works, the museum exhibits ranges of arts mainly by the artists related to Ishikawa Prefecture. The museum is highly recognized as a regionally oriented museum. Incense Burner in the Shape of a Pheasant Decorated with Overglaze Enamels, a national treasure, and Ko-Kutani are must-see items. Precious cultural properties handed down to the Maeda family of Kaga domain, which are owned by Maeda Ikutokukai, are exhibited in the Gallery for Maeda Ikutokukai-Sonkeikaku Bunko on the 2nd floor. The museum utilizes red brick buildings which were former military armories (National Important Cultural Property), and with exquisite georama and powerful video images on a large screen, the museum introduces History and Culture in Ishikawa in an easy-to-follow manner. The museum also has a substantial activity corner that allows visitors to feel materials and to experience tools from old times.	General

This is the Samurai Museum that exhibits precious articles handed down to the Kaga-Honda Family, which was founded by Masashige Honda, the second son of Masanobu Honda, who was himself a senior vassal of leyasu Tokugawa. Valuable articles, such as armor and a spear used by Masashige during the battle of Sekigahara as well as gorgeous furnishings loved and used by the daughter of Maeda family, the feudal lord, who married into the Honda family, are exhibited. The museum also offers special exhibitions that introduce crafts in the present day and has a gift shop with a unique variety of Items.
