Back in the days of the samurai, the Kaga Domain maintained a "cultural promotion policy," leading this feudal domain to develop a tradition of peerless craft techniques and to cultivate traditional performing arts such as Noh, beloved among the samurai and the common people alike. These destinations offer a great way to experience the arts and crafts that grew out of Ishikawa's unique cultural environment!

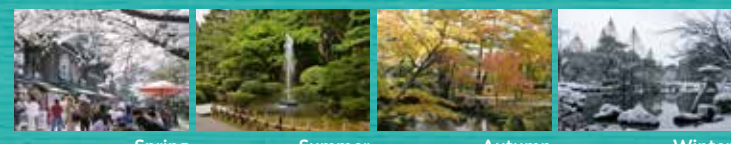

Considered one of Japan's finest gardens. Kenrokuen Garden was originally made over a long period by order of the lords of the Kaga Domain, and today it is an iconic feudal lord garden from the Edo era (17th to late 19th century). This garden is located in central Kanazawa, offering a place to enjoy natural beauty through all four seasons, even in the middle of the city.

Kanazawa Castle, originally built in 1580, serves as a symbol of the city's historic and cultural heritage. Today, this park where the castle once stood features an open feel and beautiful greenery. On Fridays, Saturdays, and the night before each national holiday, the park stays open until 21:00, lit up for visitors to enjoy.

A modern facility built into a former army building with a charmingly old-fashioned feel. This studio is the only place in Japan where visitors can watch through windows as experts restore old cultural properties like mounted scrolls, byobu folding screens, old documents, lacquerware, and more. Visitors can also learn about the restoration process through videos and informational panels.

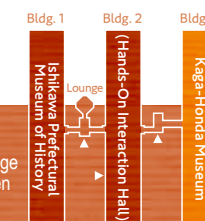

Ishikawa Prefectural Noh Theater

Free Admission*

Noh is the world's oldest performing art, handed down from generation to generation almost entirely unchanged, and has been awarded intangible cultural heritage recognition by UNESCO. Noh was particularly beloved by the feudal lords of the Kaga Domain, who promoted it among both the samurai and the common people. On days without performances, visitors can have a closer look at the unique features of the stage, such as the large jars buried underneath: a traditional way of helping the sound of the stage resonate.
