

The people have shared the legend of Noto region for many generations.


The ritual of carrying the portable shrine brings God's blessing of the 'Satoyama Satoumi'.

Projecting into Japan Sea, Noto Peninsula has developed its own unique culture and become 'Treasure Box of Festivals'. "Kiriko Festivals" are the biggest events in Noto. Accompanying portable shrines, gigantic festival lanterns called Kiriko are carried by the parishioners in countryside. Some of Kiriko lanterns can be as tall as 15 meters and as heavy as 2 tons. These types of festivals

can be seen only in the Noto region and take place in more than 200 different areas during the summer season.







Guide to "Kiriko" in the Noto Peninsula

Kiriko (切籠) originally comes from Kiriko-toro (切子 - 灯籠).

From summer to autumn across several areas in the Noto Peninsula, accompanying portable shrines (Mikoshi), gigantic festival lanterns called "Kiriko" are carried throughout the town by the parishioners.

Kiriko is the abbreviated name for "Kiriko-toro" and it is also called "Hoto or Oakashi" around Nakanoto area.

Kiriko in rectangular parallelepiped was set up to all sides and picturized some words written in kanji (Ukiji).

Like family crests with beautiful pictures. Kirikos are decorated with paper lamps (Bonbori) and straw ropes (shimenawa), And when the Kiriko lights are turned on, these images are projected fantastically.

These Kiriko Lanterns with shouldering poles are carried out at night by many people. Some areas have gorgeous Kirikos decorated with elaborated carvings, coated with urushi lacquer and gold leaves. They are sometimes called as "The Floating Lanterns".

The size of the Kirikos range from giant ones over 12 meters in height and 2 tons in weigh that need more than 100 bearers to carry it. Children carries small Kiriko in lively movement.

However, the reduction in sizes of Kirikos can be seen from 4 to 5 meters in height due to appearance of electrical wires and cables.
