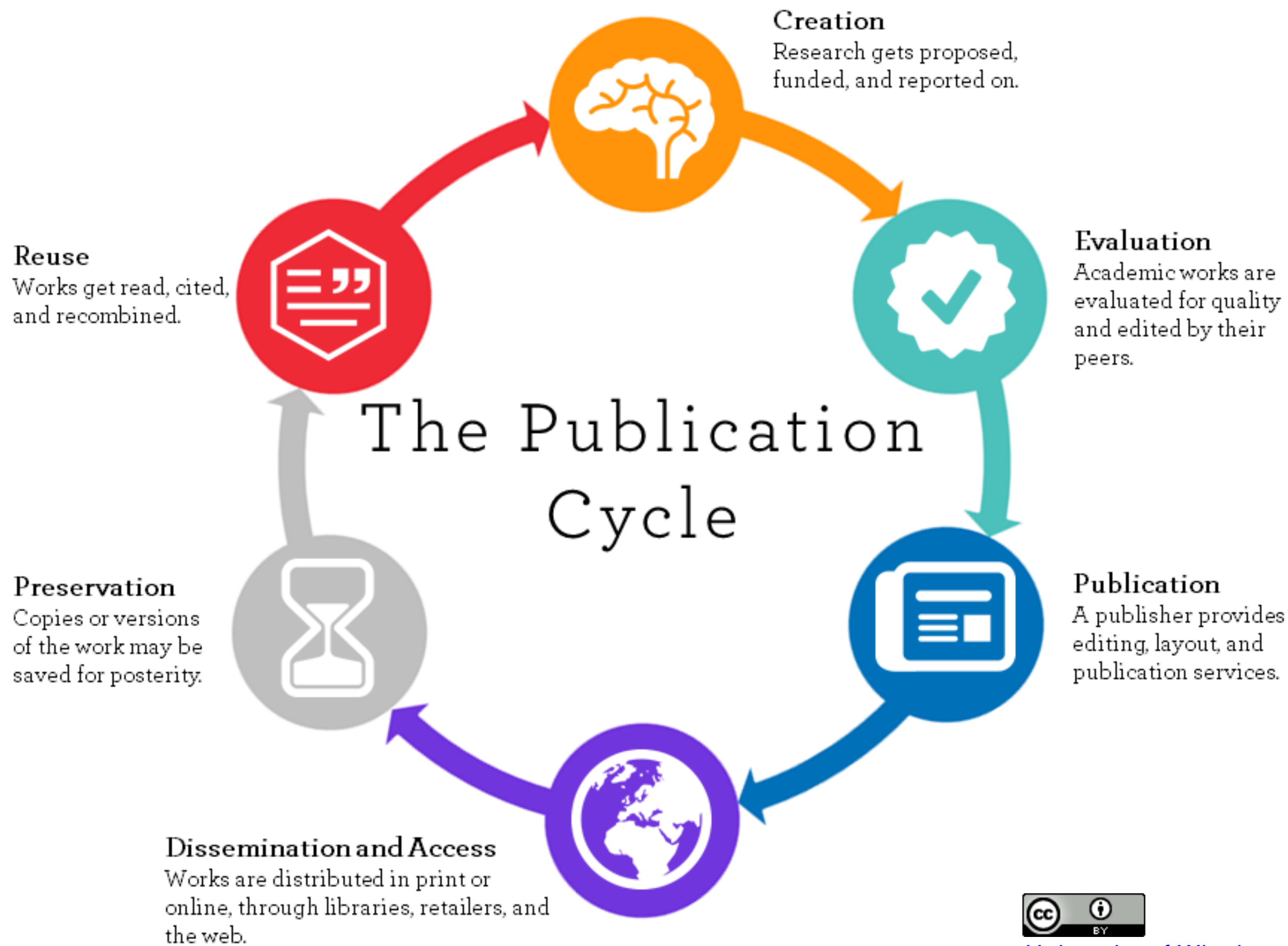

COPYRIGHT & CONTRACTS

CHECK THE JOURNAL'S POLICY & THE PUBLISHING CONTRACT:

Traditional

Author *transfers all* copyright

-
- no rights retained
 - you need to seek permission for re-use
 - common in prestigious journals

Shared rights

Author transfers copyright but *retains some* rights

-
- contract will state exactly what rights you retain

Author *retains copyright* and grants a license to the publisher

-
- you give publisher non-exclusive license to publish
 - not very common

1 Read the contract

2 Negotiate with publisher to retain rights or get permissions for re-use

3 Keep a copy of the contract and any communications

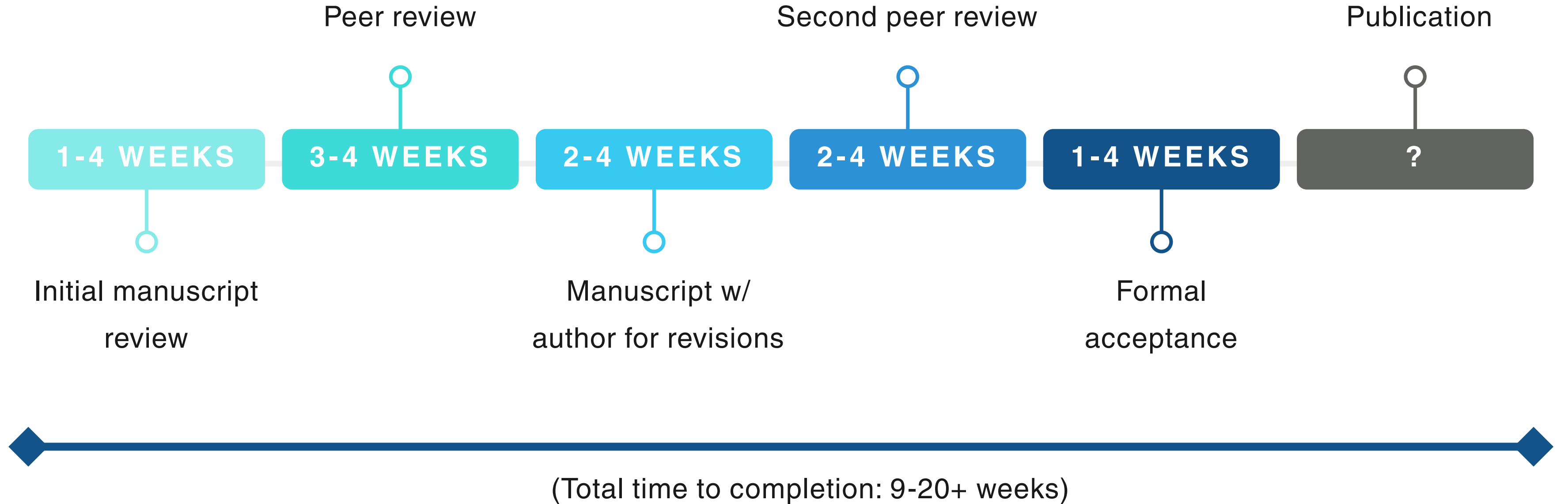
HOW LONG DOES THE PUBLISHING PROCESS TAKE?

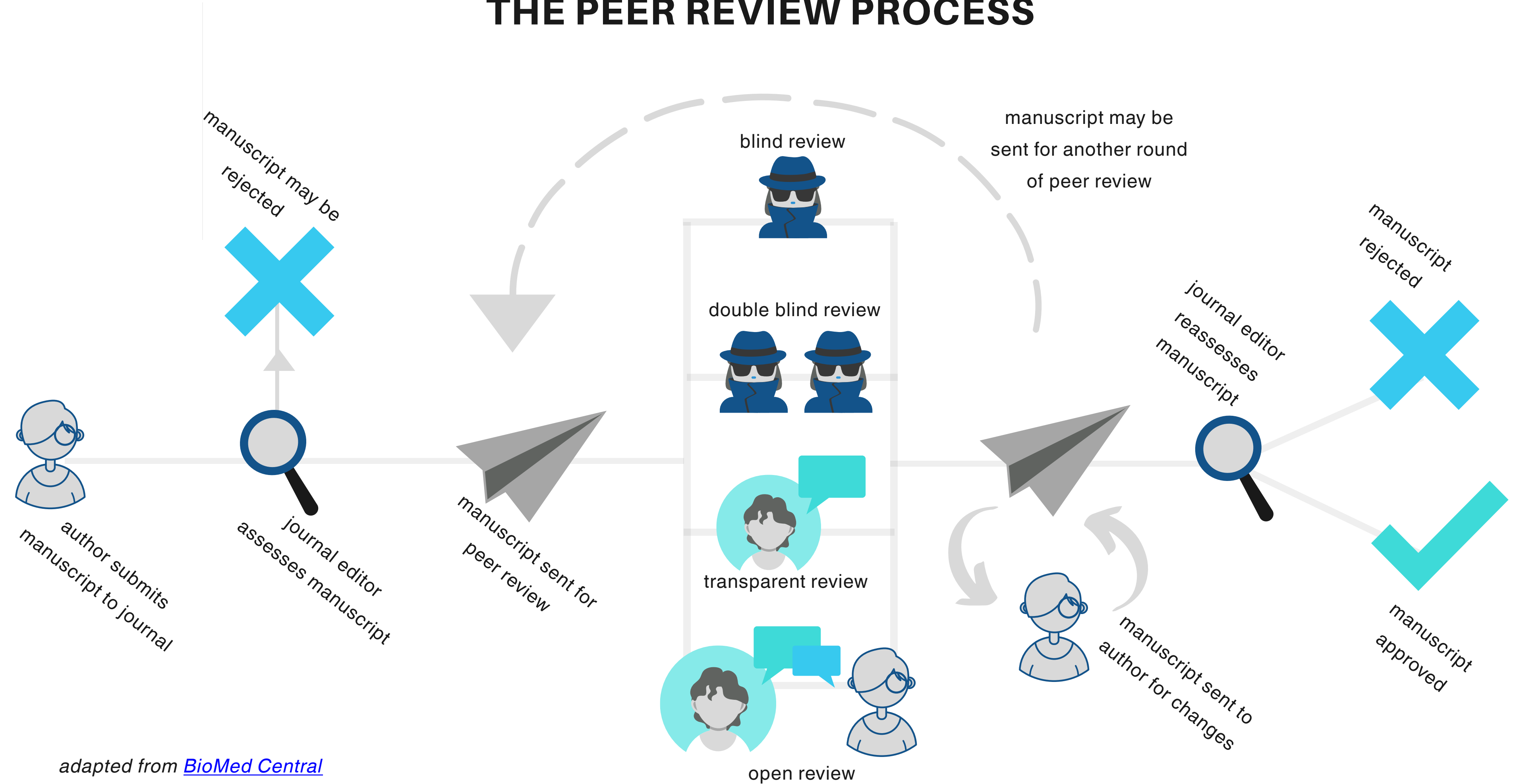
ACADEMIC PUBLISHING TIMELINE

(a theoretical example)



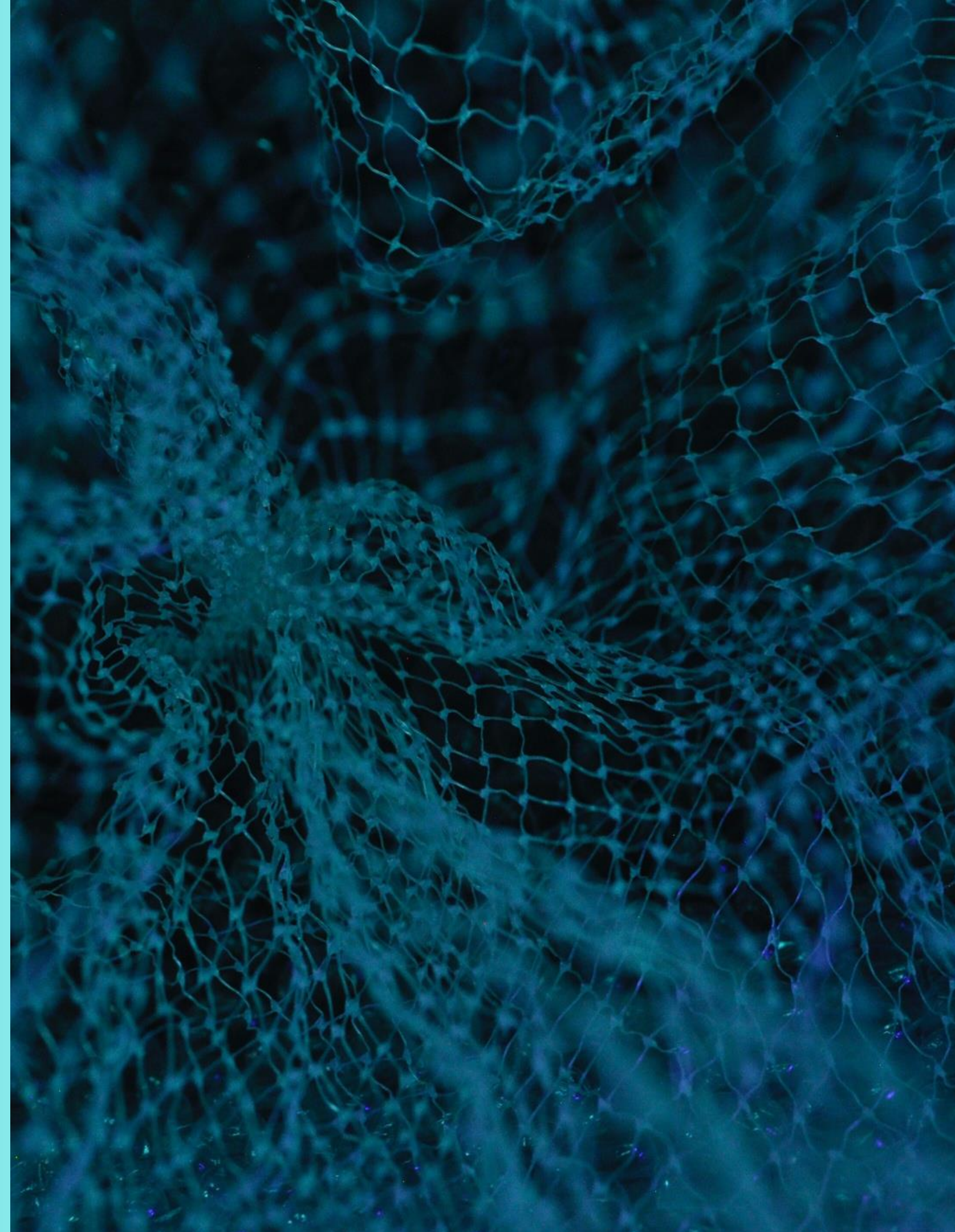

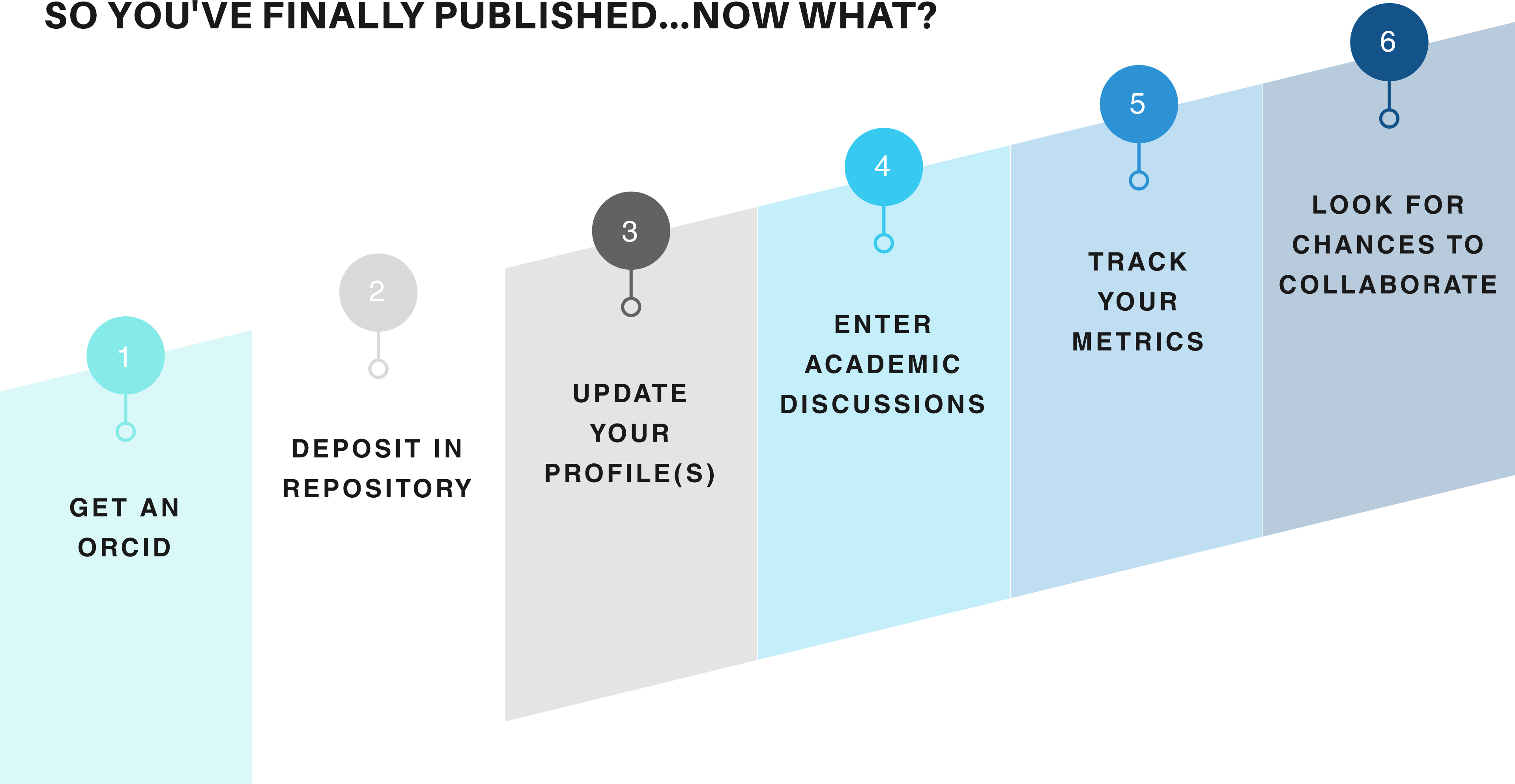

ResearchSpace is the University of Auckland's institutional repository for traditional published outputs. ResearchSpace collects, stores and preserves research produced at the University of Auckland.



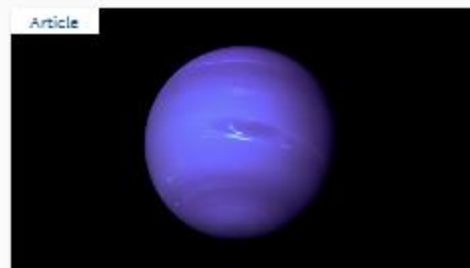
Systematic review guide
