This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

Short (Sell) OTC Options are offered by **CMC Markets Germany GmbH** ("CMC"), a company registered in Germany under registration number 114199. CMC Markets Germany GmbH (registration number 154814) is authorised and regulated by the Federal Financial Supervisory Authority (BaFin).

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You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type

Options are financial derivative instruments which derive its value from the value of another underlying instrument. This product is a Short (Sell) Over-The-Counter (OTC) ETF Option ("**Short OTC ETF Option**") entered with CMC on a bilateral basis whereby the investor sells the OTC ETF Option by taking a Short Position

Term

Short OTC ETF Options have a fixed term and automatically expire on the Expiry Date.

Objectives

The objective of a Short OTC ETF Option is to let an investor take a view on market direction and/or volatility. The investor expects the ETF to move up or down but takes on the obligation to buy or sell the ETF at the Strike Price, which may be unfavourable to them.

When you enter a Short OTC ETF Option position, you receive an option premium (the price of the option). This amount is blocked in your trading account and applied toward the respective margin requirements associated with the sale of OTC ETF Options as disclosed on the trading platform. When you close your position prior to the Expiry Date, you will receive or pay the difference between the option premium you received and the option premium you pay. If the Short OTC ETF Option is automatically exercised, you must pay a cash payment.

The option premium can change over time. This depends on several factors, including the difference between the option's strike price and the current ETF price, interest rates, the time remaining until the option expires, and the expected volatility of the underlying Equity.

You can enter into two types of Short OTC ETF Options, either:

- A **Call Option** gives the buyer the right, but not the obligation, to receive a cash payment if the ETF price is above the strike price at the Expiry Date and Expiry Time. The seller of Call Options expects that upon the option's expiration the ETF will be lower than the option's strike price. In this case, the **Call Option** is "**out of the money**" and will expire with no value. The Sellers maximum potential gross profit is the option premium received.

If the ETF price is **above the strike price**, the Call Option is "**in the money**". The gross pay-off of the seller of Call Options is calculated as the option's premium, minus the underlying's value at the option's expiration, plus the option's strike price. The seller's maximum potential gross loss is unlimited.

The break-even point is when the ETF price equals the strike price plus the option's premium, meaning there is no profit or loss.

- A **Put Option** gives the buyer the right, but not the obligation, to receive a cash payment if the ETF price is below the strike price at the Expiry Date and Expiry Time. The seller of a Put Option however expects that upon the option's expiration the ETF will be higher than the option's strike price. In this case, the **Put Option** is "**out of the money**" and will expire with no value. The seller's maximum potential gross profit is the option premium received.

If the ETF price is **below the strike price**, the Put Option is "**in the money**". The gross pay-off of the seller is calculated as the option's premium, minus the option's strike price, plus the underlying's value at the option's expiration. The seller's maximum potential gross loss is unlimited.

The break-even point is when the underlying's price equals the option's strike price minus the option's premium, meaning there is no profit or loss.

Instruments which are referenced as the underlying for an ETF options position may include but are not limited to: - a specific exchange traded fund (ETF).

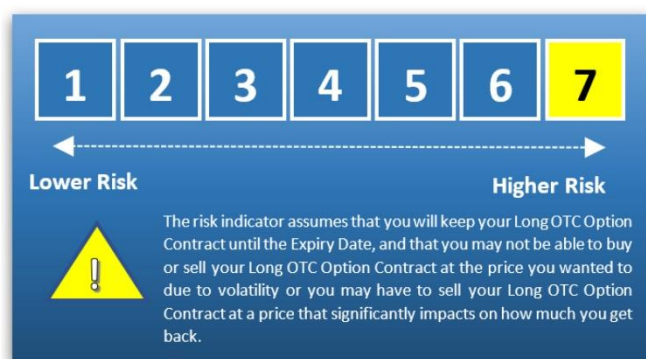
There is no recommended holding period for a Short OTC ETF Option, and it is down to the discretion of each individual investor to determine the most appropriate holding period based on their own individual trading strategy and objectives. CMC retains the ability to unilaterally terminate any Short OTC ETF Option where it deems that the terms of that Contract have been breached.

Intended Retail Investor

The product is intended for investors who pursue the disproportionate participation in price changes and / or hedging, highest risk tolerance and have a short-term investment horizon. This product is a product for clients with expert knowledge and / or experience with specialised financial products. The investor may bear financial losses exceeding the initially received premium up to the maximum amount that can be lost due to the negative balance protection.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance of the product at a very high level.

Short OTC ETF Options are complex instruments. There is no capital protection against market risk, credit risk or liquidity risk.

Be aware of currency risk. It is possible to trade Short OTC Option in a currency which is different to the base currency of your account. The final return you may get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Performance scenarios

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted. The scenarios shown are illustrations based on results from the past and on certain assumptions. Markets could develop very differently in the future.

The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances.

Before entering into a Short OTC ETF Option (Call or Put), you must make your own independent assessment and decide whether the product is suitable for you. The scenarios shown in the graphs are examples only and illustrate a range of possible returns at maturity.

For retail clients, losses will be limited to your account balance.

What happens if CMC Markets Germany is unable to pay out?

If CMC is unable to meet its financial obligations to you, you may lose the value of your investment. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Short OTC ETF Options are intended for short term trading.

There is no recommended holding period, no cancellation period and therefore no cancellation fees. You can open and close a Short OTC ETF Option at any time during market hours prior to the Expiry Date at which point your Short OTC ETF Option will automatically close.
