Perennials	Angelina Stonecrop <i>Sedum rupestre</i>	 	Evergreen creeping succulent. Lawn alternative. Plant and forget.										
	Autumn Joy Sedum <i>Sedum spectabile</i> 'Autumn Joy'	 	Succulent leaves with pink flowers. Plant and forget.										
	Hosta <i>Hosta spp.</i>	   	Variety of attractive foliage with tall flowers in late summer to early fall.										
	Bulb Mix (Daffodil, Trumpet Lily, Autumn Snowdrop, Violet Crocus)	   	Planting a mix of bulbs means blooms all year! Plant and forget.										
	Creeping Phlox <i>Phlox subulata</i>	  	Small native flowering creeping plant. Lawn alternative.										
	Elijah Blue Fescue <i>Festuca glauca</i> 'Elijah Blue'	   	Small, evergreen blue tufted grasses that stay small! Great for more formal gardens or edges.										
	Purple Coneflower <i>Echinacea purpurea</i>	   	Native wildflower that can handle occasional drought or flooded conditions.										
Shrubs	Coral Bells Azalea <i>Azalea x 'Coral Bells'</i>	   	Compact evergreen azalea, with bright pink early blooming flowers.										
	Inkberry <i>Ilex glabra</i>	   	Small native evergreen shrub with small white flowers and berries.										
	Oakleaf Hydrangea <i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i>	   	Large native shrub with large flowering clusters and great fall color that can persist into winter.										
Trees	Dwarf Southern Magnolia <i>Magnolia grandiflora</i> 'little gem'	   	Native evergreen upright tree for tight spaces with lovely smelling flowers.										
	Eastern Redbud <i>Cercis canadensis</i>	  	Native flowering tree short enough to plant under wires.										
	Crape Myrtle <i>Lagerstroemia indica</i>	  	Small tree with interesting bark and long bloom times
