## Hypothermia

Body temps can fall dangerously below normal if exposed to the cold.

Hazards can come from surprising sources. **Call your veterinarian** if you think your pet is in danger.

## **Frostbite**

Be aware that tissue damage typically doesn't appear until several days after exposure.
