The Day Lily, Easter Lily and Tiger Lily can cause kidney failure in cats

Effects of poisonous plant ingestion range from mild

nausea to death.

Signs of toxicity

- Excessive salivation
- Vomiting
- Racing or irregular pulse
- Lethargy
- Rapid breathing
- Cold extremities

Vulnerability to plant toxicities depends on:

- PET SPECIES
- AMOUNT INGESTED
- SIZE OF YOUR PET

If your pet eats any part of a plant:

1. Call the Pet Poison Helpline or your veterinarian immediately
2. Bring a sample of the plant or several photos
3. Tell the veterinary staff how much your pet ingested
