



HORSESHOE YURT RENTAL INSTRUCTIONS

ARRIVAL/CHECK OUT TIMES

Check in at 12:00pm and check out is at 11:00am. Please have the yurt ready to go for the next group.

RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT LIST

The Horseshoe Yurt is equipped for a group of up to 6 people. This includes:

- Bunkbeds and mattresses for 6: 2 full sized and 2 single.
- Cooking and serving supplies: 3-burner propane cook stove, propane, cookware, dishes.
- Heat: there is an electric heater on thermostat and a propane fireplace.
- Paper and cleaning supplies: toilet paper, paper towels, garbage bags, sponges, soap.
- Electric lighting and plugs for charging personal electronics (there is cell service at the yurt).
- Water: There is a non-potable spigot on the hill above the yurt. This water must be boiled or treated prior to consumption, or you can collect and melt snow for water. See more below.

What you will need to bring:

Sleeping bag, pillow (if desired), headlamp, food and beverages, clothing, all ski gear, personal safety gear, other recreational gear.

EMERGENCY CONSIDERATIONS

The Horseshoe Yurt is an unguided, un-hosted, basic winter rental like the rental of a US Forest Service cabin. Yurt renters are fully responsible for their own health and safety when renting the Horseshoe Yurt. Parties should be aware that organized outside rescue may not be available and that risk management, accident prevention, and, if necessary, self-rescue are the responsibility of every group using the yurt.

There is cell coverage at the yurt and in the area. SPOT Locator and Garmin InReach type devices can also initiate an emergency response.

YURT OPERATIONS/INSTRUCTIONS

-**Trash:** Pack it in, pack it out.

-**Snow removal:** Keep the deck shoveled and the path to bathroom shoveled.

-**No pets allowed at the yurt.**

-**Water:** You can boil water from the spigot on the hillside or you can melt snow to make water. Please collect snow from the area indicated with snow stakes. Use the large metal pot to melt snow, we recommend putting this on the propane woodstove to slowly melt snow for water. Once you have water, you can continue to keep it in the Igloo cooler, but please do not leave water in the cooler when you check out.

-**Food storage:** Please be sure that all food is kept either in the cooler or the refrigerator. Do not leave food out overnight or during the day; we want to be sure that we are not attracting critters to the yurt.

-**Cooking:** You will need to turn the propane tank on (down to right of cook stove) to operate. We recommend using this stove only for cooking purposes.

-**Dishes:** Use one bin for washing and one bin for rinse/ bleach (just a couple of drops in with water).

-**Bathroom:** Please only pee in the vicinity of the orange "pee ski." Use the outhouse otherwise.

-**Electric heater:** Operated by the thermostat on the wall. The switch to turn it on is on the underside of the thermostat, on the right side of the thermostat.

-Moving switch to left turns the thermostat on. Moving switch to the right turns the thermostat off.

-Switch on the left side of the thermostat is for the blue backlight.

Propane Woodstove: Just turn dial on the wall to desired time.

In the event the pilot light is out on this, stove lighting instructions:

1: Make sure gas is turned on at tank outside.

2: Open gas valve next to stove by turning lever so that it is in vertical orientation.

3: Turn the switch to 'on' on the dial on the wall.

4: Light pilot light (sometimes need to hold pilot button down for 20-30 seconds).

5: Once stove is lit, keep it on the low setting.

-Please try to use just one dish towel per group.

YURT DEPARTURE CHECK-OUT LIST:

- Dishes and cookware are clean and put away
- Wipe down counters, coolers, sink, & tables
- Pour water (gray water from sink and any unused water in Igloo/ water pot) down pit toilet
- Turn off propane to cookstove
- Leave deck shoveled and path to bathroom shoveled
- Leave bathroom clean and stocked with TP
- Sweep
- Turn off electric heaters// turn off thermostat (switch to the right to turn off)
- Turn off all lights
- Take all garbage and any remaining food with you
- Leave list for TVTAP on table of anything missing, broken, or in need of replacement
