



GROW YOUR OWN WITH

EMMERDALE

RADISH



Use a recycled container with at least 10 centimetre depth. We used an old CD box with drainage holes pre-drilled and a sturdy cardboard box. Follow the instructions on the packet of the particular seed that you have selected and ensure that they are appropriate for the growing conditions. Ideally select a round shaped radish such as “Amethyst” which is ideal for containers.



Fill the container with peat free compost and compress the compost gently and water lightly. Using a dibber, seed label or finger, create a small hole about 1cm deep and 2.5 cm apart from the next hole and sow the seeds individually. Lightly cover the seeds with compost and water.



You could sow the rows of seeds 1 or 2 weeks apart (successionally) so that you can have a continual harvest.



Place the container on a sunny windowsill or outside in a sunny but sheltered site and water regularly. Don't over-water; especially not if using a cardboard box as this encourages leafy growth.



Depending on the variety, the radish could be ready to harvest in as little as 4-8 weeks. Remember to wash your hands thoroughly afterwards as compost and seed coating should not be ingested.
