Themes: sport, peace building, values

Materials Required: scripts for each reader, PowerPoint

Desired learner outcomes: for pupils to reflect on values of sport and how to act on these values

in our everyday life

Time allocation: 10-20 minutes

Slide	Script	Suggestions
Sport and peace	Leader: Welcome to our assembly about sport and peace. Think about your favourite sport. Why do you enjoy it?	Ask children to share a few examples
Why is sport important?	Leader: Why is sport important? Sport is important for many different reasons. It brings people together to play. It teaches us lots of important things	Discuss children's ideas about why sport is important. Start with why sport is important in your school, followed by in your local community and in the wider world.
Friendship respect	Reader 1: We make new friends and build friendships when we play sport together. We learn to respect each other.	
Work together Collaboration	Reader 2: Sport teaches us how to work together. We call this collaboration.	
honesty fair play	Reader 3: We learn about the importance of honesty and how to play fairly.
