We're taking your letters to the World Bank

We have been overwhelmed by the fantastic response from parishes to Salina's letter. At the time of writing, almost 600 parishes have held a signing, that is over a fifth of all parishes in England and Wales!

Many of you have reported that parishioners were horrified to learn that farmers' seeds are effectively being privatised. Seeds are the starting point for our whole food system and were given by God for us all. As CAFOD volunteer Brian from Brentwood Diocese reports, "We were delighted by the response. However, we were surprised by the depth of feeling exhibited at the three Masses. This campaign certainly impacted on the sensitivities of our parishioners."

We will now deliver the hundreds of letters to the World Bank during their Annual Meeting in October. We will do this in two stages. Firstly, a small CAFOD delegation will attend the World Bank meetings in Morocco to speak directly to their senior staff about seed policy, and then we will hand in the letters to their London headquarters on Wednesday 11 October, with a bit of a gathering and a display of the letters. Meet Mario and Violeta: Living in harmony with the earth in Bolivia

Mario and Violeta work for CAFOD's partner organisation Caritas Bolivia. The environmental challenges facing communities in Bolivia are huge, including high levels of pollution, a lack of clean water in cities, loss of biodiversity and the effects of climate change. Caritas Bolivia works to raise awareness of the change needed to improve these environmental issues.



This work is inspired by Laudato Si', and the importance of caring for our common home - the Earth. As Violeta (right) says, "Integral ecology is the relationship that exists between humans and every other living being, not just animals or plants, but everything. We're like guardians, like administrators of all of the gifts the Lord has given us. That's how to understand integral ecology. Respect, working as a community, working together with these gifts."



Mario and Violeta work with indigenous communities and rural farmers. Mario (left) describes how the outlook of the indigenous people is different: "They don't possess an individualistic, materialistic concept of things. In their practices and customs, their culture, they have a concept of living as a family, sharing things in common. That's where their sense of place, their spirituality, comes from. They see their rights as being something they have in common, something for everyone. Benefit isn't individual, it's for all."

A special opportunity to hear Mario and Violeta live from Bolivia!

Mario and Violeta will join us live from Bolivia at our Faith in Action online event on **Saturday 18 November.** This is an annual event for anyone interested in our campaigning and advocacy work. We started this during the pandemic in place of an in-person conference and we've had over 100 people join each year, so we're running it as an online event again, from 10.30am to 2.30pm. You don't have to join for the whole thing.



As well as our Bolivia link up, we will look ahead to the COP28 UN climate talks, hear what happened when we took our Fix the Food System campaign to the World Bank annual meetings in Morocco and look ahead to a General Election.
