Prior to an assessor being appointed, we ask you to send a PowerPoint to schools@cafod.org.uk to evidence the actions from your LiveSimply action plan

- Re-read your action plan to ensure you include evidence for all the actions you listed, including the faith and learning elements.

- One or two slides per action is fine (ideally no more than 30 slides in total).
 Include photos/videos, pupil voice, thank you letters/certificates, screenshots of newsletters/social media.
 Re your main actions, please ensure you also include evidence of how the wider community were involved in the action.
- * You may wish to include feedback from others involved in your journey e.g. governors, parents, parishioners, parish priest, councillors, MPs etc
- ❖ We recommend the PowerPoint is produced so you can share it with your whole school and perhaps the wider community too.
- This is your opportunity to showcase all you have achieved.

The following slides are examples of how you may want to present your evidence. Remember you need to cover all nine of your actions, not just three.

Global action 1 – Main Living in Solidarity action

We will take part in the Big Lent Walk fundraising and raising awareness of CAFOD.

It is so important to help our global neighbours. Our whole school community acted and took part in the Big Lent Walk. The children were inspired from the first announcement of the Big Lent Walk, and the difference the money we raise can make to our neighbours around the world via the work of CAFOD. School governors and parents were invited to join our walk and local parishioners prayed for us.



The children created posters to promote the walk and to highlight why we are walking.



School action 1 – Main living simply action

Pupils and staff will each write a LiveSimply pledge, and we will create a display



We watched the LiveSimply animations and then the children and staff wrote pledges to show how they are going to 'LiveSimply' and join with others to make our world a better place just as Jesus and Pope Francis wants us to. The pledges have been displayed on our St. Francis 'pledgehog' under The Ark as an important reminder to everyone







As a main action how did we involve the wider community?

What did we learn?

In addition to learning how to grow some herbs, vegetables and flowers, we learnt that growing our own food is one way we can be more sustainable. Lots of shop bought food travels many miles before it reaches our plate and this has an adverse affect on the environment, our common home, which God has entrusted us to look after. We also grew bee friendly flowers to help the bees and insects who help pollinate plants.
