

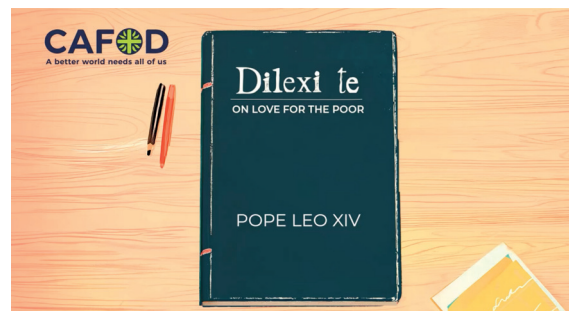
Dilexi te

Display Pack for KS1 & KS2

TEACHER NOTES

Use this pack of posters to explore the themes found in the Dilexi te animation and make a display in your school.

Running the activity



Step one: Print out the black and white colouring sheets for each child, and a quote bank for each table/group (or display on screen).

Please note: The poster with 'Love in Action' is already populated, for children who are not yet writing independently.

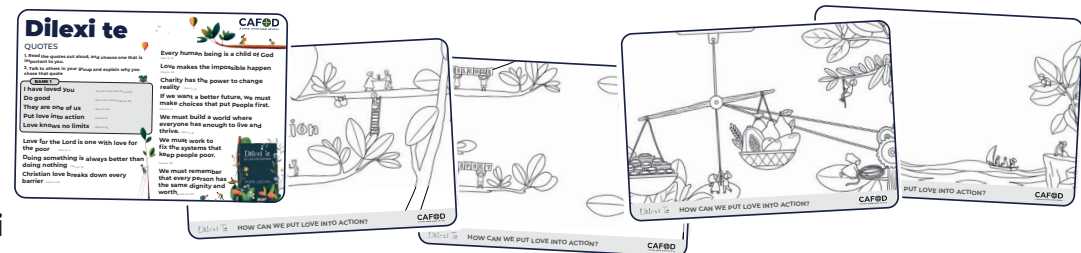
Step two: Ask the children to read the quote bank in their groups, slowly, twice.

Step three: Ask them to choose one, and then discuss why they chose that particular one. Each child picks one line and writes or copies it into the space in the middle. Before they start colouring, ask them to tell the person next to them why they chose it. For Key Stage 2, ask them to write the reason on the back of the sheet.

Step four: Colour. This is the slow part and it is meant to be. Use it for conversation, not silence.

Three questions to ask while children are colouring:

1. Who would you want to see this poster?
2. Pope Leo says people living in poverty are one of us. Who does "us" mean?
3. Now that you have designed your poster, what can you do to live out the message?



Make a Dilexi te display - spread the message!

Display the posters where people outside the classroom will see them: a corridor, the school entrance, the parish porch, or your newsletter.

This is not just about celebrating good work, it is about spreading the message. Pope Leo is clear that faith cannot be kept as a private matter, shut away from questions that affect everyone. A display that only the class sees teaches children that this is a school subject. A display the parish sees teaches them it is a message.

Ask the children if they can think of ideas of how they can spread the message of Dilexi te.

Take action!

Pope Leo says almsgiving and acts of love do not let anyone off the hook for changing the things that keep people poor, and that good intentions are not enough.

So if a child's poster says "Love can work miracles", follow it up with the question: So what miracle are you going to help with?

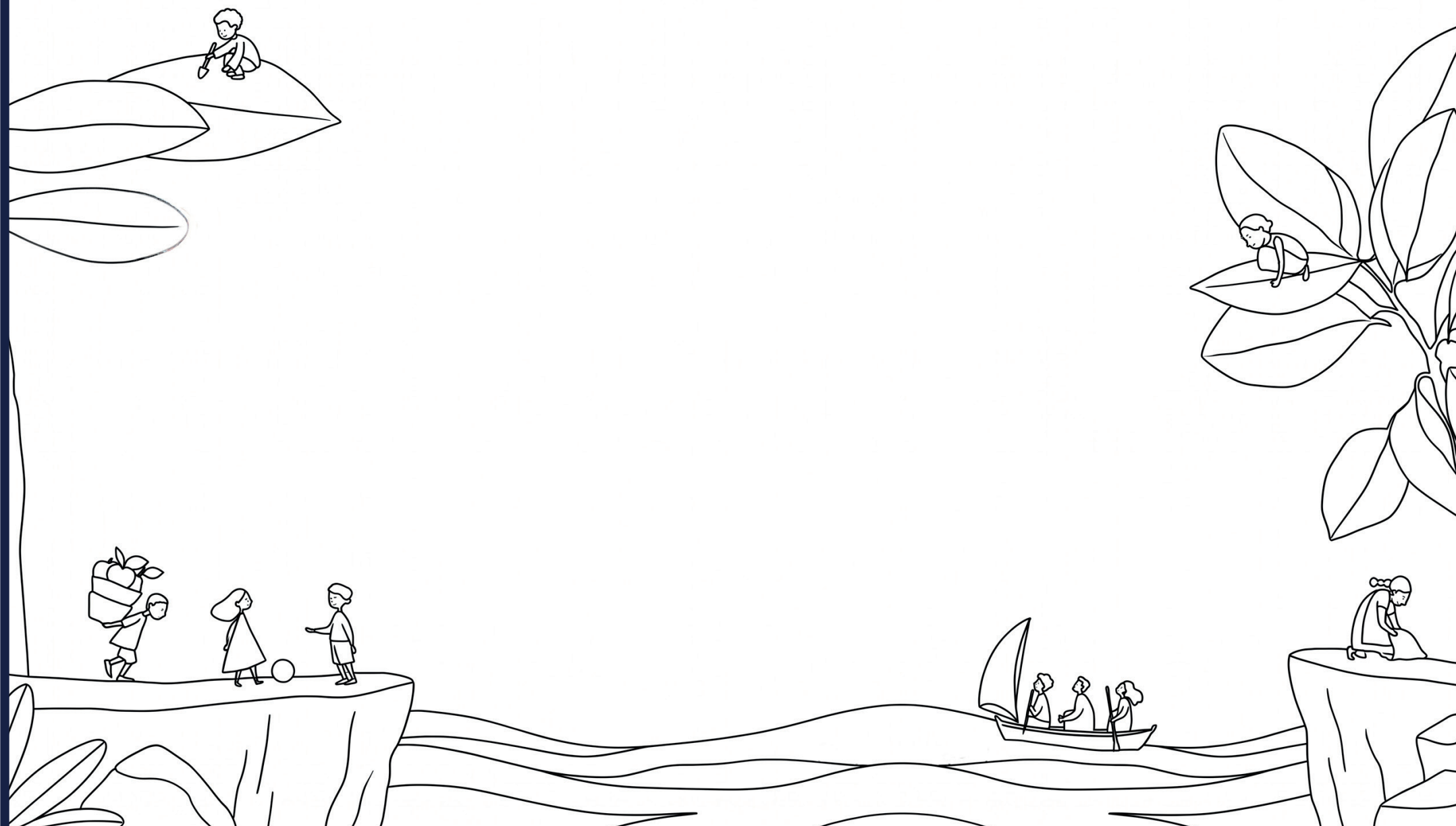
