

**Easter Sunday** Gospel: John 20:1-9 "Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in; he saw and believed."



The tomb is empty. Jesus is alive. Colour in the illustration and write or draw your hopes for the world in the rays of light.



## Easter eggs:

Did you know that Easter is not just one day? The season lasts for 50 days until Pentecost Sunday. Count how many Easter eggs there are on the sheet to see how many Sundays there are during the Easter season.

Easter eggs are a sign of new life. What signs of new life or hope can you decorate the eggs on the sheet with?

## Easter garden:

At home, try making an Easter garden. Talk about the Easter story and the difference that Jesus' resurrection makes as you do so.

## You will need:

A shallow tray or dish Some soil or sand Some twigs or lolly sticks String or glue A plant/yoghurt A large stone Moss, grass or greenery Flowers

Fill the tray with the soil or sand. In one corner make a small hill. Cover with the greenery. Make a cross from the twigs/sticks and attach together with the string or glue and place this on the hill. Put the pot on its side to represent the tomb and the large stone nearby (this is the stone that was rolled away) Add flowers or other decorations to show the new life the resurrection brings.
