



# **ESCAPE POVERTY**

ESCAPE ROOM SIMULATION GAME AN INTERACTIVE ACTIVITY FOR 11-18YRS

Millions of people around the world remain trapped in poverty. But we can change this. Our range of World Gifts is a great way to help communities overcome obstacles that keep them trapped in poverty and bring lasting change.

This simulation game is a great way to explore some of the issues affecting those trapped in poverty and to raise money for a CAFOD World Gift which will help communities around the world transform their lives.

This resource gives you the tools to raise awareness, raise money and transform lives as part of a reflection day, lunchtime activity or wider school event.

#### Getting started

This game is based on a leadership model. We recommend a leadership group of 2-4.

Students take ownership, setting up, preparing resources, running each game, promoting and keeping scores for the league table. Below is the preparation for each task as well as resources to print off.

The game is designed to be run on a cycle rather than as a one off.

#### **OVERVIEW**

This game is based on an Escape Room experience where puzzles are to be completed as quickly as possible. The team that completes the series of tasks most quickly, wins the tournament.

Each player pays to play (suggestion £2 per player). The money goes towards a World Gift, chosen by the winning team.

## RULES

Each team chooses a name and writes it on the league table. The first team is led into a room where the game takes place. There is no need to lock them in!

Leaders running the game explain the rules for each task, and are responsible for keeping the time for each segment of the activity.

Teams can re-play the game, if they wish to improve their time. But they must pay the full fee in order to do so.

A winning trophy (to cut out) and certificate are available in the pack as an award for winning the tournament.

# WATER ACTIVITY








#### Overview

This activity tests the team's dexterity and skill. The task is to fill a small cup of water on one side of the room, take it to the other side via the assault course, and fill the water filter without spilling a drop! The team should work together in relay, each taking a turn. If they spill a drop they must return to the beginning and restart.



#### Leaders' roles

The leaders are responsible for setting up this task, ensuring that it is both challenging and safe to complete. One leader should be in charge of keeping time, another acts as referee to ensure that no water is dropped. Any other leaders are there to organise the team members so that they all line up ready for their go.

#### ASSAULT COURSE

# Setting up

The leaders decide how easy or difficult to make the assault course. You can use a range of items/materials, or just a bit of imagination!

Ideal items include:
Hula-hoops to pass through
Floor ladders
Stepping stones

Or... ask the sports department for some help! Use whatever you have available.

# Setting up

The water filter can be made of a mix of charcoal, sand and gravel. For further ideas on how to do this, visit:
wikihow.com/Make-a-Water-Filter

Or just make it out of an old plastic bottle with a paper filter and some gravel. Simply cut the top off a two litre plastic bottle, turn it upside down to make a simple funnel, then place a paper filter on the top.

The water filter will require a 'fill' mark, so that players know when they have reached their target.

Stick bottle tops into the middle, so users can move each piece around.

Place on a larger board with foam edges to keep the game together.

This can be used again and again.

# **MEMORY**





#### Overview

This activity tests the team's memory and recall skills. They study a printed birth certificate for 30 seconds. It is then removed. They must redraw the same certificate on a blank piece of paper placed on the other side of the room. In turn, each team member has 1 minute to cross the room and add to the drawing, until it is complete.

#### Leaders' roles

Leaders ensure that players see neither the certificate nor their team mates' drawing before their own turn. One leader keeps time for the activity. Another leader is responsible for saying when the drawing is a completed copy of the original.

The task is only complete when all of the text has been correctly copied.

There is a time penalty for each mistake on the final certificate. Examples are:

- Wrong colour used 30 secs penalty
- Logo/mark on the wrong side 30 secs penalty

## WORLD GIFT IDEA - BIRTH CERTIFICATE

When babies are born at home in poor, rural areas it may not be possible to travel to register the birth. But this can cause problems later on.

In Zimbabwe, for example, children without a birth certificate cannot finish school, take exams, apply for an ID card, vote or access other basic services.

This charity gift can ensure babies born at home have the same opportunities as other children.

# CONCLUSION



For each team, tally up the time for each section, take away any time penalties received, and enter their score on the league table.

Thank them for taking part and supporting others to escape poverty. They are now free to leave the room. Offer them a World Gift catalogue and ask which World Gift they would like to put their fundraising towards if they win the competition.

Prepare the circuit for the next team.

At the end of the competition, present the trophy and certificate in this pack to the winning team. Make a display showing the rest of the school how the money is being spent and how they are making a difference to the lives of some of the poorest communities around the world.
