

Let's use our Catholic voice in the next General Election

The Church tells us that “...All citizens ought to be aware of their right and duty to promote the common good by casting their votes...”

With a general election on the horizon, we have joined forces with our friends from St Vincent de Paul (SVP) to launch A Year of Encounter. This new initiative invites parishes to reach out to local candidates to find out more about their views on the issues that we care about, from ending global poverty to tackling the climate crisis.

Our materials are:

- A Year of Encounter booklet explaining more about this initiative and providing a step-by-step guide on the ways you can reach out to your local candidates.
- A promotional poster to let other parishioners know if you intend to attend a local hustings.



And on the reverse, a short talk that you may wish to deliver at the end of Mass to tell parishioners about this initiative, at a time that suits you over the coming weeks.

What are we asking you to do?

You will need to gather a group of interested parishioners together so that you can collectively contact your local candidates and raise some key issues with them. There are eight suggested issues, representing the work of CAFOD and SVP, but it's up to you which to focus on.

Once you have discussed as a group, we're suggesting you contact your candidate in three ways: 1) email the candidates as a parish group, 2) attend a local hustings and 3) ask questions of candidates when they knock on your door.

Here is a prayer to Our Lady asking for her intercession and guidance this year.

Year of Encounter prayer

Mary, model of encounter,
you heard God's call.
Teach us to listen deeply
in our polarised world.

Mary, woman of courage,
you sang joyfully of God's justice.
Inspire us to challenge inequality
and call for fulness of life for all.

When does it start?

At the time of writing, the date of the general election has not yet been announced. But it could be called at any time.
