## Suggested plan

Catholic school communities have embraced the Jubilee Year with creativity and enthusiasm, journeying with 'deep faith, lively hope and active charity'. **Jubilee for Schools Celebration Day on 21 November** will be a vibrant celebration of the impact of a Jubilee Year that's been packed full of faith, learning and transformative action.

Join the <u>World Youth Sunday livestream for schools</u> which starts at 9.30am with a Jubilee liturgy and the Celebration Day film.

## If you have 30 – 45 minutes...

#### Reflect and celebrate together:

- Watch the Celebration Day film on the day. This will be available on our website and also shown as part of World Youth Sunday livestream. Visit CYMfed's <u>website</u> to register for the live stream on Friday 21 November.
- Hold a <u>Celebration of the word</u> with primary pupils.
- Help your pupils reflect on their journey this year with the <u>Jubilee journalling resource</u>
- Download and print the <u>Postcards of Hope</u> for pupils to share with family and friends.
- <u>Download the Jubilee bunting</u> and write messages of hope <u>to</u> display as part of your Celebration Day.
- Use your <u>Jubilee map</u> to reflect on your Jubilee journey.

Don't forget to add your school to the <u>map of Jubilee Pledges</u> around England and Wales.

## Make a day of it!

#### Reflect and celebrate together:

- There's still time to answer Pope Francis' call to raise our voices on international debt and join CAFOD's <u>Cancel Debt, Choose Hope campaign</u>. Write to your MP to let them know you've participated.
- Sing the Jubilee song together as a whole school.
- Reflect on art with Fr Patrick Van der Vorst as a reminder that a better world is possible.
