

# Snapshot of creation

These prompts are designed to help your family appreciate God's creation and pray together through photography. You could take the photographs together or individually and then come together to discuss them.

There are seven prompts so you may wish to take one for each day of the week and come together to talk about and pray with the photographs each evening.

**"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!"** *Philippians 4:4*

Photograph something that makes you feel happy. Praise God for his goodness and generosity.

**"The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands"** *Psalm 19:1*

Take a picture of the sky or something in nature that speaks to you of God's glory. Thank God for the gift of creation.

**"...And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow..."** *Matthew 6:28*

Photograph some flowers and thank God for his care for you.

**"So God created human beings in his own image"** *Genesis 1:27*

The Creator has created us to create. Photograph something you created that you are proud of.

**"In peace will I lie down and sleep, for you alone O Lord, will keep me safe."** *Psalm 4:8*

Photograph something or somewhere peaceful and safe. Take some time to rest in God's presence.

**"The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it."** *Genesis 2:15*

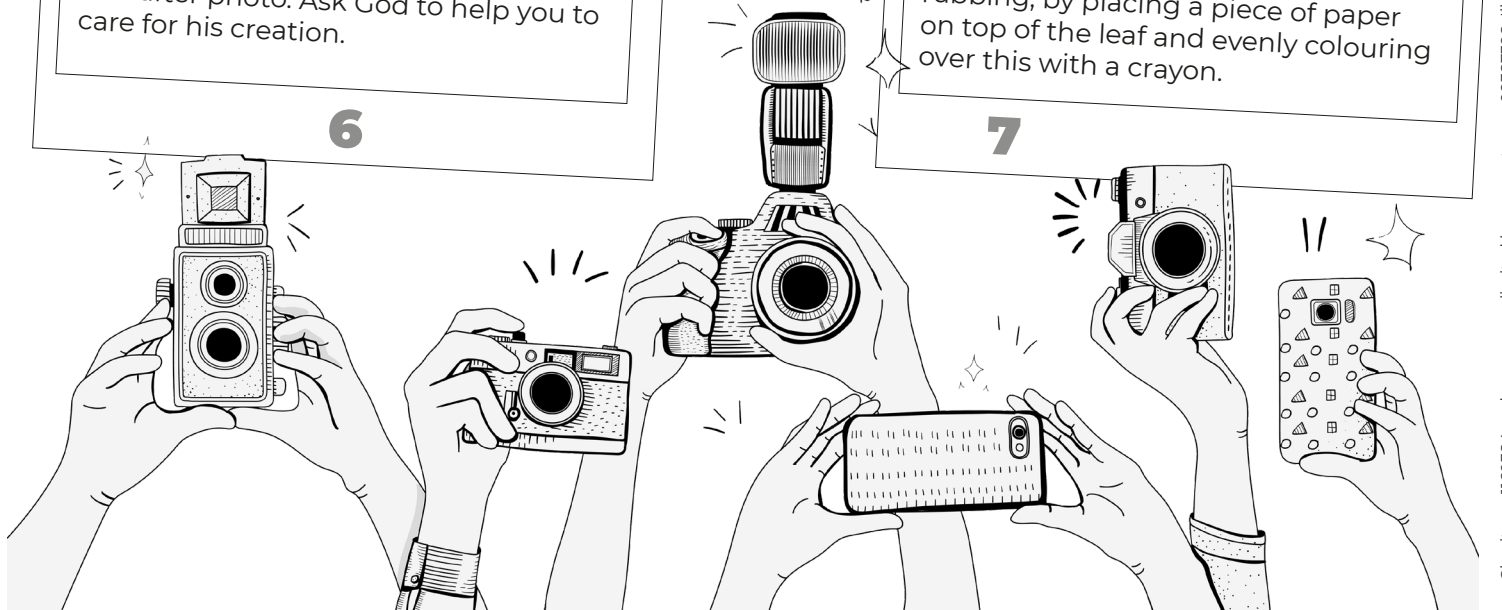
Spend some time taking care of the world; perhaps picking up rubbish or clearing clutter or weeds. Take a before and after photo. Ask God to help you to care for his creation.

**"The leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations."** *Revelation 22:2*

Take a picture of some leaves. Pray for a person, place or situation that you know needs God's healing. You could also make and photograph a leaf rubbing, by placing a piece of paper on top of the leaf and evenly colouring over this with a crayon.
