Following a Welcome to Country by Uncle Brendan Kerin from the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council, Lilly's new office was officially opened by Lilly ANZ General Manager, Tori Brown. Employees were then given the chance to explore and become familiar with their new workspace before celebrating the next chapter for Lilly in ANZ over a company-wide lunch.

The new fit-for-purpose modern workspace at 60 Margaret Street fosters an environment that better supports in-person and virtual connections, with the aim of enhancing employee productivity, collaboration and wellbeing.

The new office has three distinct 'zones' where employees can engage in focused work; crossfunctional collaboration and functional teamwork. Throughout the space there are a number of traditional meeting rooms of various sizes, informal meeting spaces, phone booths as well as Teams-enabled rooms to support improved in-person meetings and hybrid meetings.

Jamie Preston, Lilly's Associate Vice President Human Resources ANZ & NAPAC said, "These zones are designed to organise our new workplace and allow employees to choose where to sit depending on the work they do, taking into account their productivity and collaboration needs."

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) has remained top-of-mind for Lilly when designing their new workspace, ensuring the needs of all employees and visitors are met. The office is wheelchair accessible and features Hearing Assistance Technology, a parent's room and prayer room.
