Course Structure

The Graduate Diploma of Early Childhood Education is completed over three trimesters within one year of full-time study. It includes 8 core units which includes two field placements totaling 60 days, with 2-3 units per trimester. For **On-campus (Blended)** option, in Trimester 1, you will attend campus one day per week. However, during the placement period in Trimester 2 and 3, you will be required to commit additional weekdays as per the placement schedule. For **Online (+Placement)** option, you will be required to attend your placement at an early childhood centre in Trimester 2 and 3. Academic Requirements - International Students

To be admitted to the Graduate Diploma of Early Childhood Education, you must have an Australian bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in any discipline.

English Requirements - International Students

If you have obtained a bachelor's degree (AQF 7) or equivalent from a country other than Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Canada, or the Republic of Ireland, you must meet one of the following minimum English language requirements:

- An overall IELTS score of 6.5 with no band score below 6.5, or
- equivalent AE English placement test

Field Education Placements

The course is structured to maximise your opportunities to become work-ready and secure employment in an Australian early childhood education centre during your studies. You will complete two 30-day placements in Trimester 2 and Trimester 3.

Professional Experience I: 30 days with preschoolers (3 to 5 years old)

Professional Experience II: 30 days with infants and toddlers (6 weeks to 2 years)
