English requirements (International Students)

Direct Entry

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:

- Completion of Year 12 or equivalent in English.
- Completion of a higher qualification in English as the medium of instruction (Level 9 standard in Australia).
- Minimum IELTS score of 7.0 in all components or equivalent at course commencement.


Pathway Entry

Applicants must achieve an IELTS score of 6.5 (no band below 6.0) or equivalent at the start of the pathway course.

Course Outcomes

Study Options



Academic requirements (International Students)

Direct Entry

Applicants must have completed a relevant three-year AQF Level 7 degree, including at least one year (8 units) of full-time study in social and behavioural sciences.

Graduate Certificate Pathway

Applicants with an AQF Level 7 Bachelor's degree, including four relevant units in social and behavioural sciences, and completion of Acknowledge Education's Graduate Certificate in Health and Community, are eligible for entry.

Pre-requisite Unit Set Pathway

Applicants with an AQF Level 7 Bachelor's degree but no relevant study in social and behavioural sciences may complete 4 units from the Bachelor of Community Services course. Upon completing Acknowledge Education's Graduate Certificate in Health and Community, they will qualify for entry.
