Universify Education seeks **enthusiastic volunteers** who are passionate about university to act as Course Directors on our residential courses, leading a team of volunteers to deliver an authentic and inspirational experience of university life. We work with **Year 10/11 students from non-selective state schools**, helping to boost their attainment and aspirations on **our year-long programme**.

IS THIS THE RIGHT VOLUNTEERING ROLE FOR ME?

Our Course Directors must be confident, committed, and adaptable people who are **experienced in leading teams and working with young people**. This can be an intensive but hugely rewarding role, so Course Directors should be **enthusiastic** and **great at motivating others**.

WHAT DOES VOLUNTEERING WITH UNIVERSIFY INVOLVE?

Our year-long programme consists of 2 residential and monthly 1-2-1 coaching sessions. Our Course Directors **organise the residential programmes** by liaising with the Programme Team and delegating activities to Group Leaders. You will **motivate, enthuse and support your on-course team** so that courses are high quality, exciting and rewarding both academically and socially.

You will be **the primary source of contact for student and volunteer welfare** and disciplinary matters, coordination and administration.

WHAT IS YOUR ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES?

As a Course Director you will manage a team of Group Leaders and Volunteer Coaches (who are current or recent undergraduate or graduate students) to ensure the smooth delivery of the course.

- **Manage a team of Group Leaders and Volunteer Coaches:** You will be responsible for ensuring **your team is efficient and works well together**. You will also be there to make sure your volunteer team **feels supported and pass on any concerns to Head Office**. To ensure that everyone has a role to play and **knows what they're doing for each activity**.
- **Oversee the running of all aspects of the course:** You will be responsible for **making sure the course runs smoothly**. You will be **managing your team of volunteers as well as making sure activities bookings are correct, timings are correct and communicated to your team and manage the course budget**.

- **Create a safe and welcome environment:** It will be your responsibility to **make sure your volunteers feel safe and supported** during their time on the course as well as **creating a safe and encouraging environment for the students. You set the tone for the course.**
- **Manage day-to-day relations:** You and your lead team will be the **main point of contact when it comes to speaking with the conference and event staff on site.** If there is a problem that needs Head offices assistance, **you will contact the relevant staff member in a timely fashion.**
- **Making decisions when it comes to challenging and unexpected events:** You will be responsible for **making decisions around high level student disciplinary and welfare issues.**
- **Coach 2-3 students:** This is **optional.** If you choose to, you will deliver monthly 1-2-1 sessions with up to 3 students **from August to December 2026. Students will then have the opportunity to either continue coaching up until June 2027.**

WHAT SKILLS WILL I LEARN?

Being a Course Director will challenge you to think on your feet, adapt and communicate plans in a dynamic environment and manage a large team of young volunteers.

You will receive **specialist training in coaching, mentoring and child safeguarding** and receive coaching support on the residential courses and throughout the year.

In addition to the skills and experience you will gain through the programme, **we run an opt-in full-year training programme to further improve your employability skills.** You will have the option of **becoming a certified Mental Health First Aider** as well as developing your coaching skills and your understanding of working with young people.

PRACTICAL DETAILS

- **Voluntary:** we will cover course-related expenses and travel to and from residentials (within the UK)
- **Accommodation:** on residentials, we will provide some accommodation. Priority goes to Course Directors, Group Leaders and people coming from outside Oxford and Cambridge
- **Meals:** all meals are provided at the partner college during the residential courses
