

ERCHED ON A SANDSTONE RIDGE ALONGSIDE SINGITA PAMUSHANA LODGE in the remote Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve in Zimbabwe, this elegant exclusive-use villa was designed to offer families and friends the relaxed freedom to tailor-make their days any way they want, with a dedicated private chef, game vehicle, Field Guide and host catering for their every need.

Malilangwe House features expansive living areas and five bedrooms with private decks, an interactive kitchen, a signature Singita 'bar-deli' and a large rim-flow pool. With its panoramic views of the surrounding landscape and beautiful Malilangwe Dam below, this contemporary African home is set within 130,000 acres of untouched wilderness, making for an unforgettable luxury safari.

ACCOMMODATION

Singita Malilangwe House is an exclusive-use villa with a master bedroom and 4 smaller bedrooms – this includes a private guide, vehicle, host and chef.

Preparing for your journey

SUGGESTED PACKING GUIDE

Cotton clothing in neutral colours such as green, khaki and grey is recommended for game drives and bush walks. It is advisable to avoid white and dark colours as they tend to attract bugs. If it rains during a game drive, waterproof ponchos will be provided. No formal wear is required at any of our lodges.

Use the weather as your guide:

- October April:
- Casual summer clothing (shorts and lightweight shirts) with a warm jersey or sweater for the cooler morning and evening temperatures.
- May September:
 Casual lightweight clothing with a very warm parka or windbreaker jacket for the very cold mornings and nights.

To ensure a comfortable safari experience, we recommend that you bring the following:

- Comfortable walking or track shoes, or hiking boots for walks as well as sandals to wear around the lodge.
- A swimming costume or bathing suit, sun block, sun hat, sunglasses, lip balm, mosquito repellent.
 (Lip balm and insect repellent will be provided, but if you prefer a particular brand, you are welcome to bring it along.)
- Video camera, camera, binoculars and extra memory cards.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Singita Malilangwe House is situated in a malaria-risk area; it is therefore essential that you consult your medical practitioner regarding anti-malaria requirements prior to your visit.

Our location

Location of Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve [A]

The Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve is set on 130,000 acres of wilderness in the southeastern corner of Zimbabwe, bordering the Gonarezhou National Park. Malilangwe remains virtually untouched by humankind and occupies a key position in an area that is potentially one of Africa's largest bio-refuges. The vegetation on the ridges and rocky outcrops is characterized by flat-topped Mountain Acacia woodlands and ironwood thickets. The area is home to hundreds of baobab trees and an unrivalled assortment of birds with more than 500 species, including many raptors. This is where you will find Singita Pamushana Lodge, one of Africa's most exclusive, remote hideaways.



Location of Malilangwe House [B]

Singita Malilangwe House is set amongst towering trees overlooking a lake of 1,500 acres in the remote reaches of the pristine Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve which spans some 130,000 acres of wilderness in the southeastern corner of Zimbabwe, bordering the Gonarezhou National Park. This exclusive-use African home takes its cue from the rich tribal culture of the local Shangaan people, who have lived in the region for thousands of years. Beyond the villa, hundreds of baobab trees punctuate the untouched wilderness of ridges, outcrops, ironwood and Mountain Acacia woodlands, which are home to a great variety of rare and abundant wildlife, as well as hundreds of bird species and ancient rock paintings.





Getting to Singita Malilangwe House

BY AIR

We can arrange scheduled flights or private charters.

- The Federal Air scheduled flight between Buffalo Range International Airport and OR Tambo International Airport in Johannesburg is currently available on Mondays and Thursdays only.
 - A minimum booking of three nights' accommodation at our lodge is necessary when selecting this option.
 - The weight of luggage is restricted to 20 kg (44 lb) for checked baggage and 5 kg (11 lb) for hand luggage.
 - Flight duration is approximately 1 hour 45 minutes and Buffalo Range is located 45 minutes from the lodge.
- Chartered flights can land at Lonestar airstrip, 12 minutes from our lodge. Guests are collected by Singita staff and transported to the lodge in a game viewer vehicle.
- Private aircraft pilots land at their own risk at Lonestar airstrip and are advised to broadcast their flight plan on frequency 118.700 MHz.

If flying from South Africa, guests need to clear customs at Buffalo Range.


BY ROAD

- Pampering treatments are available in the dedicated spa area, in-room or on the decks.

- Complimentary internet access (WiFi). Due to the remote location of the villa, the wireless connection can be slow and intermittent.
- Mobile phone signal available dependent on area coverage.
- Electricity supply is 220V AC. Converters are also available. Hair dryers are supplied in each suite.
- Children of all ages are welcome and we offer activities tailor-made for families.
- In the interest of safety, childrens' participation in game activities will be at the discretion of your guide.





Weather and temperature

BEST TIME TO GO ON SAFARI

Southern Africa is a year-round destination. Traditionally the dry winter months (April to October) are best for game viewing, due to the shorter grass, lack of foliage and the absence of water which forces the game to concentrate around the remaining sources of drinking water. Annual rainfall, usually in the form of short afternoon thunder showers that clear up within an hour, occur from December to March. Many species give birth to their young around the start of the rainy season which is when the bush comes alive with newborn animals.4




Check-in/check-out times and lodge closure
