THE 2024 Serengeti Girls Run experience

or the seventh consecutive year, runners of all fitness levels are invited to join this multi-stage all-women run. Traversing the pristine wilderness of Singita Grumeti's private concession in the Serengeti – home to an abundance of wildlife and a unique ecosystem – this exclusive event is part of Singita and the Grumeti Fund's Safaris with a Purpose and will raise funds for empowerment programmes for girls in rural Tanzania.

The run involves a flexible, multi-stage distance of 21km per day. Whether on foot or supporting the runners in the shadow vehicle, participants will also be able to engage with local girls and learn more about the Grumeti Fund's work in the region.

Every evening guests are able to enjoy guided evening game drives that provide a front-row seat to this exclusive 350,000acre protected reserve.

On completion of the run, participants will have the option to learn more about the Grumeti Fund's community and conservation programmes.

These programmes include a career fair for local high school girls, an option to visit the Anti-Poaching Canine Unit and take a tour of the new centre for Research and Innovation for the Serengeti Ecosystem (RISE). Encompassing various life-changing moments and the chance to connect with the heartbeat of the Serengeti, the event allows participants to share meaningful experiences with like-minded women while making an impactful contribution to the empowerment of girls in rural Tanzania.

Each of the nine tented suites at Singita Sabora Tented Camp features elements like a private meditation deck, with views of the surrounding grasslands, a beautifully curated in-room pantry and dining space, and an outdoor sala with daybeds and scatter cushions – perfect for reading or marvelling at the plains game passing by.

With tents set close to the ground, Sabora allows guests to be completely connected with their natural surrounds, and continuously immerses them in the sights and sounds of the Serengeti.

With its intuitive simplicity and craftsmanship, décor that echoes the earthy colour palette of the bush, modern interpretations of campaign furniture evoking the timeless spirit of East African adventures, and the romance of a tented safari on the plains, it's the perfect setting for this experience of a lifetime.

event impact

Various empowerment initiatives have made a positive difference in the lives of young girls. Fewer are leaving school due to unwanted pregnancies. Easier access to sanitary pads means more hours are spent in school – positively impacting pass rates.

There has been a greater awareness around issues of harmful cultural practices such as Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) and early marriages, giving young girls the opportunity to make different choices for their lives. Scholarship distribution is more balanced (45:55) and girls are excelling not only in academics but also advancing to higher education.

Another major mindset shift is that boys are actively supporting the girls' empowerment agenda - supporting their friends and sisters. This collaboration is fostering a more inclusive and harmonious environment where everyone has a chance at a brighter future.

- Total girls who have participated in girls' empowerment sessions from 2017 to 2023: **10,042.**
- Total girls who have received reusable sanitary pads: **9,414.**
- Total boys who participated in boys' empowerment sessions from 2021: **3,800.**
- Total girls and boys reached through empowerment sessions to date is **13,842.**
