



**What Is My Child Learning?**

Your child is learning the Ways to Stay Safe and eight safety rules called the Never-Never Rules. Your child is also learning adults can help keep him or her safe.

**Why Is It Important?**

Using the Ways to Stay Safe and the Never-Never Rules helps your child decide if a situation is unsafe. Students also need to know how to refuse to break a safety rule and report to an adult.

**Ask your child: What are the Ways to Stay Safe?**

**Read Together:** It is the job of adults to take care of you and keep you safe. Keep yourself safe by using the Ways to Stay Safe and following the Never-Never Rules. The Ways to Stay Safe are Recognize: Is it safe? What's the rule? Report: Tell an adult. Refuse: Say words that mean no. The Never-Never Rules are:

- Never ride on wheels without wearing a helmet.
- Never cross the street without checking all ways for traffic.
- Never play with fire.
- Never touch a dog without asking the person in charge.
- Never use a sharp tool without an older person's help.
- Never touch guns.
- Never ride in a car without wearing a seatbelt.
- Never go in water without an older person watching.
