SHOWCASING OUTBACK AUSTRALIA

2024 will again be showcasing rugged outback Australia. Departing from an iconic Barossa Valley vineyard the first port of call is the Silver City. The journey from Broken Hill heads north east through some of Australia's most spectacular country, which given the summer rain should be green and lush, and concludes close to 3000km later on beautiful Magnetic Island.

The 2024 OZ Outback Odyssey will be both challenging and rewarding. Here are some of the highlights:


- ★ Australia's longest populated mining town, Broken Hill, is referred to as The Silver City.
- ★ Corner Country, where you'll find dramatic scenery, fascinating history, exhilarating drives and tiny goldfield towns.
- ★ Visit Australia's most remote Pub and the Pub with no Town.
- ★ Travel the same roads Cobb and Co. once serviced.
- ★ Australia's furthest town from the ocean, surrounding pastoral properties and oil and gas fields.
- ★ Channel Country it doesn't get much more 'Outback' than here, with its stunning vistas, picturesque ruins and historical sites.
- ★ Exclusive tours of the home of Qantas in the heart of the outback.

- ★ The home of Banjo Patterson's 'Waltzing Matilda'. Reputedly inspired by an 1894 shearer's suicide, first performed 6th April 1895.
- ★ Crossing the rolling downs country of northwest Queensland, to a town located on the bank of Queensland's longest river, the Flinders.
- ★ Spend time in the home of an annual country music festival, a town once described as the second most important city in Queensland when gold production peaked late in the 19th century.

Magnetic Island is well known for its distinctive environment and picturesque landscape featuring large granite boulders, hoop pines, sandy beaches and fringing coral reefs.

An unexpected link to South Australia is the wreck of the SS City of Adelaide, which ran aground at Cockle Bay in 1916 while being transported. It is located 300 metres offshore and is accessible during low tide.

Magnetic Island is sure to be a memorable destination after spending a week experiencing the harsh beauty of the channel country and Western Queensland.

EXPLANATION OF FEES

CREW FEES

Per person crew fees cover all meals and camping / permit expenses on the event as follows;

MEALS

Your meal ticket includes all meals from lunch Saturday 27th July – Saturday 3rd August (including the final presentation dinner in Magnetic Island).

CAMPING / PERMITS

The cost of camping and permits at various towns on the journey are included in your crew fee.

Limited accommodation is available on the event due to the remoteness of destinations. If accommodation is preferred over camping then this will be at the expense of the entrant and you will need to book and pay. You will also need to book and pay for your own accommodation at the final destination, Magnetic Island.

MERCHANDISE PACKAGE

Each entrant / crew fee will include shirt, coffee cup, (brewed coffee daily), commemorative woven patch, stubby holder, insulated water bottle all with the Oz Outback Odyssey label.



HOW DO I ENTER THIS ADVENTURE OF A LIFE TIME?

- The Oz Outback Odyssey welcomes entrants from all over the world.

- If you have paid the non-refundable \$100 hold your spot fee, this will be deducted from the \$1500 deposit.
- A non-refundable deposit of \$1,500 (Inc GST) per vehicle entered is required and payable by 28th February 2024.
- The balance of your fees must be paid by 31st May 2024.

ODYSSEY REGULATIONS

- To be eligible, all Odyssey cars must be 30 years or older. This is defined by: the date of the manufacturer compliance plate as of the 30th of June of the event year.
- Support vehicles must be 4WD - any age.
- All vehicles must have current registration and third party insurance and cars pass scrutineering day.
- All participants, whether in an Odyssey vehicle or a support, must be 18 years or over and must sign an indemnity form.

EVENT BENEFICIARY



Australia's most reputable charity, the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) provides 24/7 emergency aeromedical and essential primary health care services to those who live, work and travel in rural and remote Australia. The RFDS conducts over 100 aeromedical flights of the critically-ill or injured across the country – 15 of these in South Australia every day.

But the RFDS cannot continue its life-saving work for all Australians without the continued support of the community. The RFDS relies on bequests, sponsorships and donations from the community to meet the shortfall in its operational funding and to purchase and medically-equip its 'flying intensive care units' – at a cost of more than \$7 million each.

The RFDS is the major beneficiary of the Oz Outback Odyssey and will receive a minimum 75% of the net proceeds from the event. The Oz Outback Odyssey Committee and the entrants involved have a strong passion for supporting remote communities and have over the years supported the RFDS in various fundraisers at local towns and stations.

The Oz Outback Odyssey is very pleased to be supporting the RFDS as our major beneficiary and we look forward to this partnership continuing well into the future.

The Committee has the discretion to make payments to local groups during our event each year. During the 2021 event, a donation of \$2,000 was made to the Isolated Children's Parents Association South Australia.
