Guardian ad Litem Attorney

Must discuss all important issues with you.

MUST MEET YOU AND LISTEN TO YOU.



NO Is not kids. Is may n

Is not required to meet all kids. Staff or volunteers may meet instead.

Cannot share what you say unless you give permission.

Yes

CANNOT TELL OTHERS
WHAT YOU SAY.



They are required to tell the judge and others what you say.

Must explain your case and all your legal options.



MUST EXPLAIN THE LAW TO YOU AND GIVE YOU LEGAL ADVICE.



No

May explain your case but can withhold information.



MUST ADVOCATE FOR YOU TO PARTICIPATE IN YOUR COURT PROCEEDINGS



And, cannot tell the judge if they disagree with you.



MUST LET THE COURT KNOW
WHAT YOU WANT.



But, can also tell the judge if they disagree with you

After conferring with you and offering you legal advice & counsel.



MUST ADVOCATE FOR WHAT YOU WANT.



Must advocate for what the GAL thinks is best for you.

Can be sued if they make a mistake that causes you harm.



ACCOUNTABLE IF THEY MAKE MISTAKES.



Cannot be sued if they make a mistake that causes you harm.
