The artist storytellers on stage tonight are using their intelligence, imagination, and courage to make magic. They draw from their personal stories, their hardships, and their joy. And they pour all of that into their work. That's why it's so entertaining and moving and fun and why it speaks directly to us. Artists seem to know us. They speak directly to our hearts. But they also challenge us and inspire us to do better, work harder, and dream bigger.

We all need artists. That is abundantly clear. But I think they need us too; they need us to do our part; to give their work added meaning and purpose. They need us to hold ourselves accountable in this time of much needed reckoning, to evaluate our structures, to work with them and on their behalf in conversation with our community. They need us to listen closely and find ways to make changes; to dismantle systems of oppression and racism. Artists inspire me to be honest with myself and recognize that I have contributed to and benefit from a system that isn't equitable. Recognizing systems of oppression is important, but it is only a marker at the beginning of a journey. The real work, and the reward – a more just, equitable and anti-racist world that we can make together - lies ahead.

There is another powerful system in place here today: the ecosystem of live performance, with the dynamic relationship between audiences

and artists. That ecosystem creates a place where we can laugh and cry and learn from each other; where we can rise above our limitations and our differences and be joyful together.

Some of you experienced that here at the Ordway's loading dock when we screened *A Breath for George* that honored the life of George Floyd, created and generously shared with us by our friend Austene Van and New Dawn Theater. I hope you will celebrate that same spirit of love and dignity, words made immortal by legendary U.S. Representative John Lewis, and so evident in the film, *John Lewis: Good Trouble*, an intimate account of his extraordinary life and legacy I hope you'll take part in the Ordway screening of that film on September 21.




