David Gonzalez | The Boy Who Could Sing Pictures

October 26 | 10:00 AM & 12:00 PM Ordway Concert Hall | 50-60 minutes Recommended Grades 1-5

David Gonzalez returns to the Ordway with stories that empower the voices of young people. In The Boy Who Could Sing Pictures, based on the book by Seymour Leichman, we meet Luca, son of Bustelo-the-jester. Luca discovers that when he sings, spectacular pictures appear in the sky, reflecting the truth of the world and people around him. The adventure follows Luca through a summer-long tour of surprises, wonders, and a fateful encounter with evil ministers who fear that Luca's songs may reveal too much... Luca learns to trust his talents as he saves the day and the kingdom too! In the accompanying story of Nina Nails *It*, based on a Persian tale, a savvy girl teaches a wizard where his true heart resides. This performance features the music of Heitor Villa-Lobos and Astor Piazzolla, along with original compositions and arrangements by Daniel Kelly.

The concert brings together Raehann Bryce-Davis and Brandie Inez Sutton, two of today's most exciting operatic voices, as they pay homage to Marian Anderson and Jessye Norman, artists who paved the way for them and other African American opera singers. The repertoire features compositions by George Frederic Handel, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, Giacomo Puccini, Giuseppi Verdi, Richard Strauss, George Gershwin, Margaret Bonds, Harry T. Burleigh, Richard Smallwood and a newly commissioned work from Damien Sneed.

Disney's Beauty and the Beast | Musical Theater


December 6 | 10:00 AM Ordway Music Theater | 2.5 Hours Recommended Grades 4-12

Literature to Life | *The Latehomecomer* February 22 | 10:00 AM & 12:00 PM Ordway Concert Hall | 50-60 minutes

Recommended Grades 9-12

Told with the immediacy of the author as a young girl, born in the Ban Vinai Refugee camp in Thailand, Kao Kalia arrives in the United States when she is six. The story follows her journey from a quiet, reticent student struggling to speak English while facing racial discrimination, to a self-empowered young woman claiming her voice to tell the untold story of her people. In search of a place to call home, thousands of Hmong families made the journey from the war-torn jungles of Laos to the overcrowded



refugee camps of Thailand, finally emigrating to America; but lacking a written language of their own. Driven to tell her family's story after her grandmother's death - the Hmong experience has been primarily recorded by others - *The Latehomecomer* is Kao Kalia Yang's tribute to her remarkable grandmother whose spirit held them all together. It is also an eloquent, firsthand account of a people who have worked hard to make their voices heard.

Just a few days before Martin Luther King Jr Day, spark a conversation on Race, and plant the seeds of change.




My Fair Lady | Musical Theater

Jarabe Mexicano invites audiences on a joyride through a versatile songbook of Mexican Folk as well as Rock & Roll, Tex-Mex, Latin Rock, and Reggae-Cumbia. Performing on stringed folk instruments accompanied by lively percussion, Jarabe's dramatic, harmonized vocals in Spanish and English have gained them the admiration from audiences across the country. Cultural anthropologist, distinguished author, and admirer Dr. Alejandro Lugo raves that Jarabe's musicians "are truly excellent and bring new blood to the musical traditions they perform... their version of La Malagueña is simply the best I've heard in decades, if not ever."




