Arts Education is for everyone—we're excited to share in learning with you!

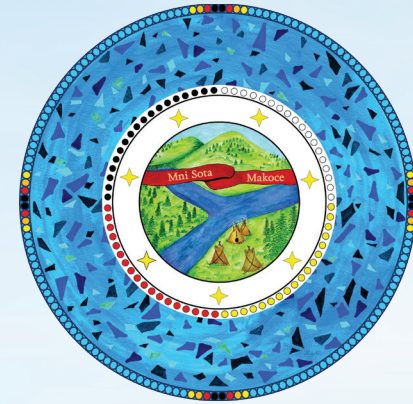

This place is also known as Imnizaska Oturwe (Village along the White Cliffs).

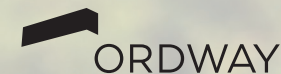

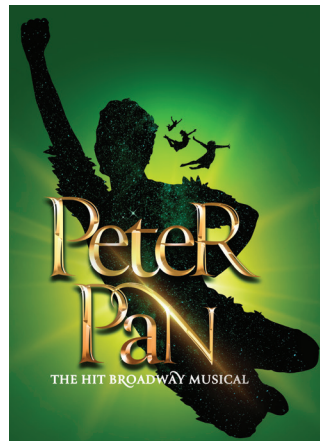

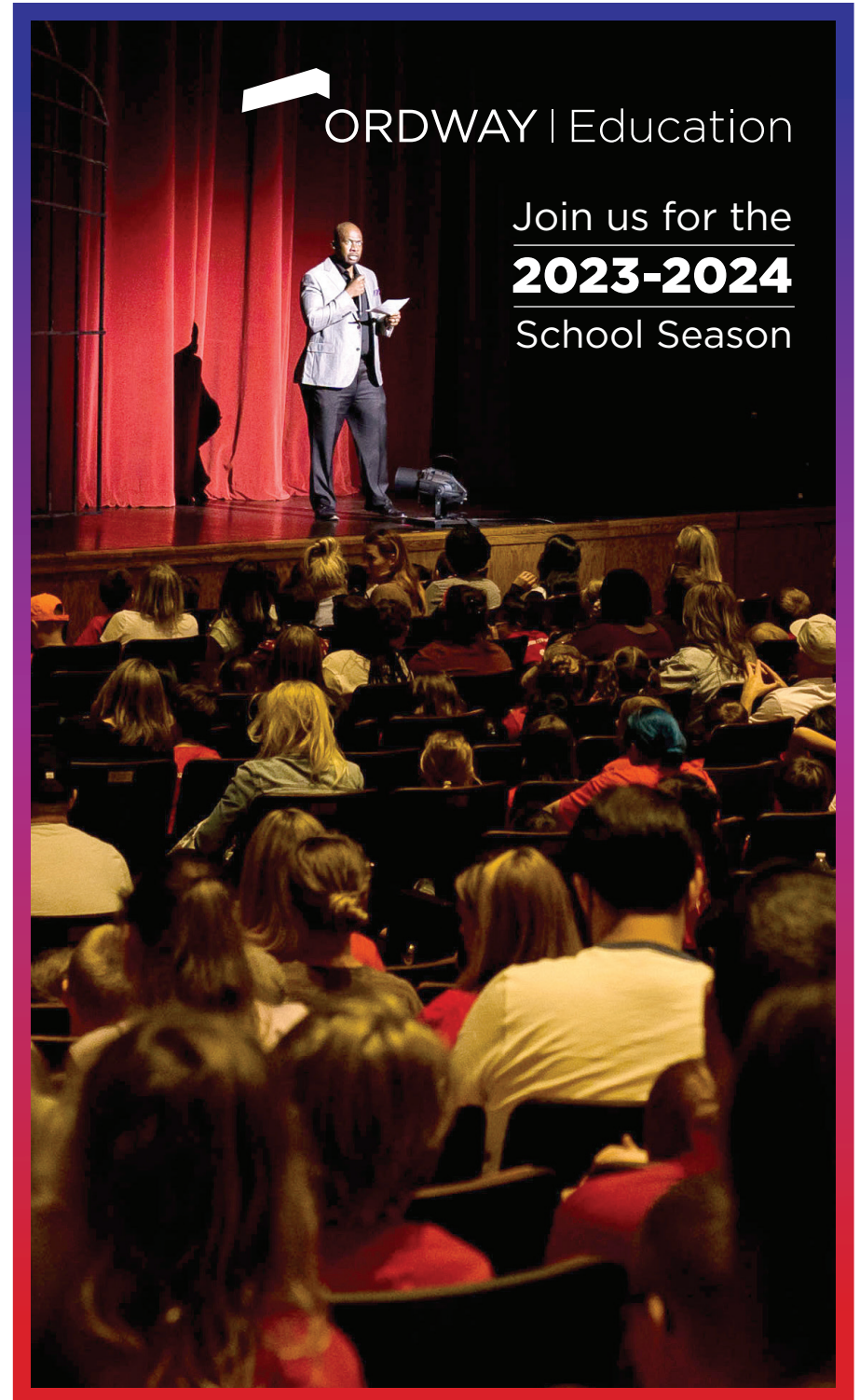
