The Sampson Bros

Hoops x Health x Healing

The Sampson Bros, Lumhe & Samsoche Sampson (Seneca/Mvskoke), have been Hoop dancing for more than 28 yrs while visiting and teaching various indigenous communities throughout Turtle Island (N. America) and beyond. Witness and experience Indigenous Hoop Dance from their unique perspective, enlighten one's mind and invigorate the spirit through their evolutionary artistry. The Sampson Brothers are Indigenous citizens of the Seneca Nation (in Upstate NY) and also Mvskoke (Creek) on their father's side from Oklahoma. Dancing at Powwows throughout their lives has groomed the Bros. in the various dance styles of Grass, Fancy, Hoop, and Powwow Social Dances. Strengthening their own voice and identity through practicing culture of song and dance has allowed them to share, teach, and learn while giving respect and consideration to all walks of life. With performance experience since early childhood, the Sampson Bros. began performing outside of traditional contexts as an evolutionary step into modern Native dance. Even just after graduating high school, they began performing, along with family, with various musicians on-stage to complement the story telling capacity, as rhythms expressed and reciprocated through the body and hoops. Rock, Pop, Blues, R&B, Country and, of course, HipHop / Rap were among the genres that influenced and shaped their experiences and very well carried them throughout Turtle Island (N. America) and beyond.
