Pricing, Access, and Refund Reality

Go Digital Income is typically priced between \$17 and \$37 depending on the offer window, but the price is only revealed during checkout rather than being clearly displayed upfront.

The system does come with a 60-day money-back guarantee through ClickBank, which reduces the risk of trying it out. Access is instant after purchase, and there are no recurring subscription charges.

For anyone reading a Go Digital Income Review trying to decide purely based on cost, the entry price is relatively low compared to many similar training systems, but transparency could definitely be improved.
