



Take your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 out of the box and take a moment to get to know where everything is. It'll come in handy later.




Getting started and plugging in - Follow steps 1-5 to get connected

Start here if you have a master phone socket.




These instructions are for Copper or Part-Fibre connections.

You may know these as Business Broadband or Business Fibre.



You need to use a micro-filter for every phone socket in your office with any phone or broadband equipment plugged into it.


Start here if you have a pre-filtered phone socket.




You need to use a micro-filter for every phone socket in your office with phone or broadband equipment plugged into it. N.B. Do not plug your broadband cable into the phone socket.

Getting started and plugging in - Follow steps 1-5 to get connected








Ensure the Network Terminating Equipment (NTE) is powered on. The NTE may be white or black.


Use the ethernet cable to plug into the WAN port on the Hub.

Switchingon






Push the power button on the back. A LED light on the front tells you it's on (see status light guide below).



Insert the power cable into the Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 and the plug into the wall. Turn on the switch.



Keep your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 upright and facing into the room for the best signal.

Status light guide




Blinking amber: your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 is starting up



Blinking amber and white: connecting to the internet

Solid white: you're connected to the internet




Remember

The first time your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 is set up, it might take a few minutes as the device needs to download the latest updates which will be indicated by a flashing amber LED light. If the solid white light never comes on, visit business.talktalk.co.uk/wifihub

Connect your devices

Wireless connection



Have your Wi-Fi settings sticker handy.

Wired connection

Connect the ethernet cable to your device. Plug the other end into any of the yellow ports at the back of the Business Wi-Fi Hub 3. If you have an Full Fibre connection you may have to obtain additional ethernet cables to connect other devices.



How you connect varies from device to device (check the manufacturer's instructions). But generally you:


• Go to settings and turn on Wi-Fi.

Click on your Wi-Fi network name (you'll find it on your Wi-Fi settings sticker).

Enter the password from your Wi-Fi settings sticker (use CAPITALS).

Click on 'join' or 'connect'.






If you see this symbol on your device, you've made the connection.


If not, check your manufacturer's instructions for your device. Phones, tablets and computers can all vary.






Top 4 tips to boost your Wi-Fi





If using Copper/ Part-Fibre, plug your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 into your master phone socket for best performance. It is usually close to the front door.



Leave your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 on all the time. Turning it on and off will slow down your connection.




Setting up Guest Wi-Fi

Keep your Business Wi-Fi Hub 3 upright and up high. Not on the floor.
