Project Background:

In 2023 the Downtown Cambridge BIA established an outdoor art gallery space named The Galtway as part of a revitalization initiative for the Water and Main Street alleyways in Downtown Cambridge. The Galtway is divided into 3 gallery rooms, each with a distinct theme, art form and lighting. The first of those gallery rooms is the rotational gallery, which has a traditional gallery space theme and uses the historical limestone walls as a backdrop to display nine vinyl-wrapped art panels highlighted with overhead lighting. Each of the nine panels will display printed replications of the proposed artwork. An additional one panel displays information about the Artist and their work.

Opportunity Overview

The Artist selected to have their nine pieces of work shown in The Galtway will be contacted via email on February 14, 2024 to be notified that they were awarded the space to commence March 2024 and be on display until February 2025.

The work will be presented on a series of nine (9) portrait-orientated frames that are approx. 8' by 5'. Each frame is wrapped in the artists reproduction work on digitally-printed vinyl. All mediums of art are considered as long as they are suitable for reproduction in a 2-dimensional high-resolution image that can be printed on the vinyl. Costs to print and install the vinyl panels are covered by the Downtown Cambridge BIA. Please note that the pieces are suspended approx. five feet above ground level.

Proposal Requirements

Please ensure you have read over all listed requirements for this call for submissions. An incomplete or late submission package will result in your submission not being accepted by the selection committee.

- 1. Completed Project Form
- 2. Curriculum Vitae (Max 1 Page)
- 3. Artist Statement (100 words)
- 4. Design Concept
 - a. Overall concept for the work
 - b. A brief description of each of the 9 pieces
 - c. Describe how your pieces will impact and influence the community
 - d. If awarded, describe how this showcase will effect your art practice
- 5. Nine (9) Proposed Photos For Exhibition
 - a. Images must be JPEG
 - b. Max file size of 100 MB
 - c. File name format: initialsyeartitle01.jpg (applicant's initials, year of work, title of work, image number).

Note: The Downtown Cambridge BIA uses Google forms and Drive for our submissions. You will have to create a Google account if you haven't already.

Artist's Eligibility and Considerations

Eligibility

- This request for submission is open to all emerging and established artists and art collectives.
- All forms of visual and mixed media art will be considered as long as they are suitable for reproduction in a 2-dimensional high-resolution image that can be printed on the vinyl wrap.
- Note: Art Collectives and teams must share the total commission awarded.

Considerations

- Artists will be responsible for creating and submitting a high-resolution digital file of their proposed art in the format required and specified.
 - High-resolution (at least 300 dpi) PDF, Adobe Illustrator .ai files or .esp files are required for production.
 - Artwork must be of the size 60" x 96" (ratio) 5:8
- The Downtown Cambridge BIA contractor will be responsible for printing, and installing the artwork in the gallery. The Artist will have the right to approve the formatted layout of their design before installation.
- The Artwork may address any theme or topic.
- The artwork must NOT contain content that breaches any intellectual property, trademarks, logos, brands or images. It can NOT depict any offensive, vulgar, or illegal activity. The use of and inclusion of tobacco, alcohol, or marijuana will not be accepted. The art must **not** promote any political party or election candidate. Any depiction of demeaning or derogatory portrayals of individuals or groups or anything that the general prevailing community would likely take deep or widespread offence will not be accepted or tolerated.
- While all means possible will be taken to preserve the work, due to the nature of the gallery and its location, artwork may be damaged by the elements or the public. In the event of damage, the artwork will be assessed and the necessary remedy will decided at the discretion of the Downtown Cambridge BIA.

Selection Criteria

Submissions will be evaluated based on the following weighted criteria:

- 45% Artistic Merit
 - Quality of work, both from a technical and aesthetic perspective
 - Originality
 - Evidence of broad thinking and conceptual clarity
 - Concept is meaningful and impactful
- 40% Appropriateness to the Site
 - Describes how the piece will impact and influence the community

- Meets technical requirements for printing at scale and on vinyl
- \circ $\;$ Adhered to requirements for no offensive and obscene images and text.
- 15% Qualifications and Professional experience
 - Previous experience with exhibitions
 - Connected and local to the community
 - Impact on how this showcase will effect their art practice

If further clarification on the Artist's submission is required, the Selection committee will reach out to the Artist.

Selection Committee

All submissions will be reviewed by a selection committee of 6-7 members headed by the Downtown Cambridge BIA, including local business members, property owners and community members. The Jury will vet all applications and meet between Feb 10-13th, 2024 with final decisions made and posted on February 14, 2024.

Budget

Artist fee: \$2,000.00*

*The Downtown Cambridge BIA covers printing and installation cost.

Jury Review: February 10th - 13th, 2024

Artwork to be Installed: March 1, 2024

Notice of Award

The selected Artist will be notified by email on Wednesday, February 14th, 2024. A contract to display the work will be provided at that time. The signed contract and nine (9) pieces for display and printing will need to be provided to the Downtown Cambridge BIA by February 21st, 2024 at the latest to be prepared for printing and installation.

Due to the volume of submissions, only selected artists will be contacted.

Publicity

The Downtown Cambridge BIA shall have exclusive rights to issue all public announcements regarding the competition, including but not limited to social media. The BIA will inform the Artist when they may communicate their participation in the project.

Ownership and copyright

The Artist retains all ownership and copyright for the works being presented. At the same time, the Downtown Cambridge BIA reserves the right to use the images of the work displayed for promotion and marketing purposes of The Galtway gallery.
