As we reached the mid-way point in our year, I found myself taking stock. Almost 40% of all cage-free policies are due in 2025—that's over 1,000 companies, making 2025 a critical year for companies to make good on their promises. And with just 6 months until 2025 begins, it was time to find out where we stood.

As I sat and reflected on our progress so far, and the work left to be done, I was filled with overwhelming gratitude. It's thanks to your generosity that we've been able to hold dozens of companies accountable for their commitments to spare hens from abject cruelty. A recent Open Wing Alliance (OWA) report found that 89% of commitments that have come due worldwide have already been fulfilled. That means that our strategy is working—and hundreds of millions of hens will never face life in a cage.

While there is much work left to do, I know the second half of the year will be even more impactful. Thank you for making this possible. YOUR COMMITMENT TO THE HUMANE LEAGUE MEANS THAT WE WILL CONTINUE FIGHTING INTO 2025 AND BEYOND—UNTIL EVERY HEN IS FREE FROM HER CAGE. ONWARD!

what does cage-free look like AROUND THE WORLD?

In Q2, the OWA released the <u>2024 cage-free fulfillment report</u>, which found that **89% OF CORPORATE CAGE-FREE EGG COMMITMENTS WITH DEADLINES OF 2023 OR EARLIER HAVE BEEN FULFILLED WORLDWIDE.** With over 1,000 commitments coming due in 2025, this is a positive indicator that companies are taking their commitments to animals seriously and making real change for animals. And for the companies that fall behind, it's a chance to remind them that The Humane League will keep up the pressure until every hen is free from her cage.





IN LATIN AMERICA, LARGE-SCALE CAGE-FREE

TRANSITIONS are beginning to take place. Brazil has shown remarkable strides in this transition: seven years ago, there was no industrial cage-free production in the country. And now, Brazil's top two egg producers have switched to cage-free facilities, affecting millions of hens and proving that cage-free transitions are achievable—even ahead of set deadlines.





IN EUROPE, THE CAGE-FREE FLOCK REPRESENTS THE MAJORITY OF EGG-LAYING

HENS, reflecting years of progress from animal advocates and the OWA. In the UK, 80% of egg production is already cage-free!



IN NORTH AMERICA, CAGE-FREE PROGRESS CONTINUES TO GROW.

The US cage-free flock went up to 40.2% of the total egg-laying flock in February 2024. 11 states have passed cage-free laws.

2024 CAGE-FREE EGGSPOSÉ

In April, we launched the <u>2024 Eggsposé</u>, calling out the restaurants that have failed to report their US cage-free progress ahead of their 2025 deadlines to protect hens from extreme confinement. As a result of pressure from this year's report, 13 companies have made cage-free progress—ONCE THESE COMMITMENTS ARE FULFILLED WE ESTIMATE THAT'S MORE THAN 1.9 MILLION HENS WHO WILL BE SPARED FROM BATTERY CAGES, EVERY YEAR!



THE HUMANE LEAGUE UK

Thanks to our colleagues at THL UK, more than 80% of UK egg-production was cage-free for the first quarter of 2024. That surpasses a 3-year goal we had set as part of their strategic plan: **TO SPARE MORE THAN 30 MILLION HENS FROM CAGES BY PUSHING CAGE-FREE PRODUCTION OVER 75**%. And this is good news for hens beyond British borders: Europe tends to set the standard for animal welfare, and the rest of the world follows suit.

BATTLEGROUND DOCUMENTARY

WE RELEASED A POWERFUL NEW MINI-DOCUMENTARY, BATTLEGROUND. Battleground tells the story of Wisconsin resi-

dents fighting to protect land, water, people, and animals when a new concentrated animal feeding operation (CAFO) was proposed by Big Pork. A multi-town partnership took it upon themselves to research possible health risks of the raw manure and pollution the site would produce. *Watch the full documentary here.*





THE OPEN WING ALLIANCE LAUNCHED A GLOBAL CAMPAIGN AGAINST ICONIC MAYONNAISE PRODUCER KEWPIE, which uses 10% of all eggs produced in Japan. While the company has already made a commitment to source 100% cage-free eggs in certain regions, it has yet to do so globally. The OWA's campaign against Kewpie continues THL's focus on multinational companies headquartered in Asia—where around 62% of the world's egg-laying hens live.
