Dear Secretary of State,

We are writing to thank you for your commitment to a call for evidence this year to assess the impact of banning cages for hens. As we mark the one year anniversary of the Government's Action Plan for Animal Welfare, we urge you to launch the consultation with immediate effect, as a step towards a future where hens can be free of cruel and outdated cage systems.

The Action Plan for Animal Welfare commits to "examining the use of cages for laying hens" but after one year there has been no public consultation with stakeholders on the issue. Up to 14 million hens are currently in enriched cages in the UK. Without a ban, even if all UK corporate cage-free commitments are met by 2025, it is estimated that up to eight million hens will remain in cages annually.

A consultation is needed urgently to begin the process that could lead to the ending of cages for hens, and to help ensure that the UK does not fall further behind its neighbours on this issue. Austria, Switzerland, Germany and Luxembourg have banned enriched cages and the European Commission has committed to proposing legislation to phase out cages. In the US, Arizona recently became the tenth state to ban the use of cages for laying hens. The UK must ban cages for hens as soon as possible to maintain its status as a world leader in animal welfare.

Banning cages has enormous public support. According to a report published in 2020 by the Conservative Animal Welfare Foundation, 76% of consumers want the banning of cages to be a priority. Food industry giants such as Nestlé, Greggs and Waitrose have also <u>called for a ban</u>.

As stated in the Action Plan for Animal Welfare, "The way we treat animals reflects our values and the kind of people we are." We are united in this statement, and we know that keeping hens in cages goes against the very ethos of the Action Plan.

The Government must do all it can to move the process to end keeping hens in cages forward. The time is now, there is no reason for further delay, so we urge you to launch the consultation on the impact of banning cages for hens now.
