What is unbundling?

Unbundling means breaking down your legal problem into parts. You and your lawyer decide which parts your lawyer will do and which parts you will handle on your own. You pay only for the work the lawyer does.

What tasks might my lawyer do?

With unbundling, a lawyer can provide you with a wide range of services including:

- · giving legal advice
- preparing documents (drafting specific documents or reviewing your draft)
- coaching you (for example, guiding you through a mediation or negotiation)
- representing you in a hearing or court application





What are the advantages of unbundled legal services?

Expert assistance

You get professional assistance. You are supported where you need it the most.

Affordability

By completing some tasks yourself, the costs are lower than when a lawyer does everything for you. You can develop a budget and spend your money on the tasks you need the most help with.
