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Celebration Days are an annual Science Museum celebration of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color in STEM—a celebration recognizing the value of BIPOC representation in STEM, celebrating the STEM accomplishments and resilience of BIPOC individuals and providing opportunities for our community to form and invest in ongoing relationships.

STEM STUDENT PANEL

This year for our Celebration Days, the museum will host a series of STEM student panels. Each panel will feature 3-4 BIPOC students pursuing undergraduate, graduate, professional or trade STEM education. The panelists will share their stories, experiences, and advice for other young people interested in pursuing STEM education.

We are asking interested students to commit to the following:

- Meet with SMM staff prior to the event (0.5 hours)
- Review the prompts and prepare for the panel (1.5 hours)
- Travel to the Celebration Day Event at the Science Museum (0.5 hours)
- Participate in the student panel at the in-person Celebration Day Event (1 hour)
 - 30 minutes: moderated panel discussion
 - 30 minutes: Q&A with audience
