

1937 Plymouth Deluxe 4-Door Touring Sedan

Just completed 10 year, six figure complete restoration by the renowned Mike Mancini American Muscle Car Restoration in North Kingstown, RI.

Originally painted Plymouth Beige, now repainted in period correct Wedgewood Blue.

The Plymouth Deluxe 4-Door Sedan was Plymouth's most popular offering in 1937, as Plymouth maintained its third place among American auto brands that year.

Built January 15, 1937, the car was shipped to the Bud Johnson Plymouth and DeSoto distributorship in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Presumably, the car spent some time in Minnesota: at one point, the engine was replaced (a not uncommon occurrence as the Depression and World War II limited both means and opportunities to purchase new cars, so cars that might otherwise be discarded were instead repaired and rehabilitated), and the stamp on the replacement engine begins with "MINN," as then required by state law.

This vehicle was discovered in a barn in Kingman, Arizona, in October of 2000. After a series of amateur restorations over several years by owners in Arizona and Southern California, it was purchased by its current owner in 2009 in Thousand Oaks, CA. From 2012 through 2023, it underwent meticulous restoration by Mike Mancini's American Muscle Car Restoration, Inc. in North Kingstown, RI (www.amcri1.com.)
